FAST AND FURIOUS ACTION PROMISED IN COMING RODEO

Action will come fast and furious; there will not be a dull moment throughout the two to two-and-a-half hour performance when some of the country's greatest cowboys hit the fairgrounds park arena next Saturday and Sunday afternoons at 2:30 to compete for approximately \$1,600 in purses at the second annual Medford wild-west rodeo staged by Max Barbour.

From the moment of the grand entry at 2:15 sharp, to be featured by the appearances of the mounted Ashland Trailriders and the mounted Yreka, Cal., and Jackson county sheriff's posse along with all the rodeo performers, until the final session of the Brahma bull riding contests, event will follow event with lightning-like rapidity. Barbour has emphasized there will positively be no waiting between events.

There will be four major events on the program both days. Following the grand entry and short drills by the mounted posse, the first session of the wild Brahma bull riding contest will be held. This will be followed by calf roping, bucking horse riding and bulldogging in that order.

Interspersing the four major events will be a musical chair race, a wild-cow milking contest, nightshirt and novelty races, trick roping exhibitions and acts by Si and Fanny, famous clowns, and their trained mule, Abner. The shows will be closed by more Brahma bull riding.

Barbour stated that reserved seat tickets for both performances, on sale at Jarmin's Pennywise drug store, were selling at a rapid rate, and warned those planning to attend the rodeo to obtain their duets as soon as possible in order to assure themselves of obtaining good seats.

Washington, Sept. 18.—(AP)—President Roosevelt today completed reorganization of the labor relations board by nominating Gerard D. Reilly of Massachusetts as a member to succeed Edwin S. Smith, also of that state, who failed of reappointment when his term expired recently.

Half Million Fight In Southern States

Armor-girded land forces of the second and third armies locked today in a terrific struggle along a 75-mile wavering front from Alexandria, in central Louisiana, westward to Texas as the simulated warfare involving 500,000 men, reached its highest tempo since the start last Sunday.

Massed infantry, artillery, cavalry and armored forces drove through tangled underbrush and thick forests while overhead opposing air forces were engaged in support of their land forces.

BEVERAGE AGENT IS CHARGED WITH SHORT DELIVERIES

Ralph Wendell Hapner, 32, salesman for the Coca Cola Bottling company, waived preliminary hearing in justice of the peace court Wednesday afternoon on a charge of obtaining money by false pretenses. It was understood Hapner would go directly before Circuit Judge H. K. Hanna on a district attorney's information to enter a formal plea.

Arrested by state and city police on a warrant based on a complaint filed by Charles Bateman, proprietor of the Riverside Market, Hapner was released on \$1,000 bail.

The complaint, police said, alleged that Hapner charged the Riverside market for seven cases of Coca Cola while delivering only five. Police quoted the salesman as admitting that over a period of time he had followed the same procedure at several local stores, and that he estimated about 300 cases at \$1.30 a case had been "shorted" the various merchants.

Hapner, according to state police, said that the reason for his alleged manipulation of deliveries was because he had lost money playing punchboards.
