RECORD TAX BILL WAITS SIGNATURE

Washington, Sept. 18.—(AP)—Final senate approval sent to President Roosevelt today the \$3,553,400,000 tax bill—biggest revenue measure in history and one designed to help defray the mounting costs of national defense.

The legislation, which would impose heavier burdens on virtually every citizen and corporation in the country, was expected to receive Mr. Roosevelt's signature promptly. Final approval came on a voice vote. The bill's heavier taxes on individuals and corporations would be effective on income for the current calendar year while most of the excise, 94 "nuisance" taxes, would go into effect October 1.

LINDBERGH ACCUSED OF SERVING HITLER
Seattle, Sept. 18.—(AP) Charles A. Lindbergh was accused of attempting to divide the American people through anti-Semitism during a national crisis, by Dave Beck, international vice-president of the teamsters union, in a radio address here last night.

"If we start fighting each other we are lost," Beck said. "Hitler has won thus far, because his enemies were divided. He will continue to win as long as people listen to men like Lindbergh."

SCHOOL LEADERS ARRANGE SALE OF DEFENSE STAMPS

E. H. Hedrick, city school superintendent, Leonard B. Mayfield, principal of the senior high school, and Glenn L. Linn, principal of the junior high school, met with Frank Hull, city chairman, this forenoon to arrange for the sale of U. S. defense savings stamps in the schools. It was agreed to set up a teacher organization in the senior and junior high schools to carry on an educational program regarding defense savings bonds and stamps. Arrangements will be made also to have the savings stamps available for purchase in the schools. Next week Mr. Hull and Mr. Hedrick will meet with the principals and teachers of the grade schools to arrange a plan of action.

Sheriff Syd I. Brown is arranging for the sale of defense savings stamps in the county courthouse and savings stamps are to be available in the superintendent's office in city hall. Three thousand pieces of educational literature on defense savings bonds and stamps are being prepared for mailing to citizens by the water department.

TWO MORE NAZIS KILLED IN PARIS

New York, Sept. 18.—(AP)—The NBC listening post heard the London radio say late today that two German soldiers had been killed and a third wounded in the most serious anti-Nazi attack yet in German-occupied Paris.

Paris, German-occupied France, Sept. 18.—(AP)—German authorities announced today that shooting of hostages in reprisal for attacks on Germans would be extended to include not only communists but "all classes of the Paris population." The announcement came as a German non-commissioned officer died of bullet wounds inflicted Monday by an unidentified assailant in defiance of the executions for previous attacks on members of the army of occupation.

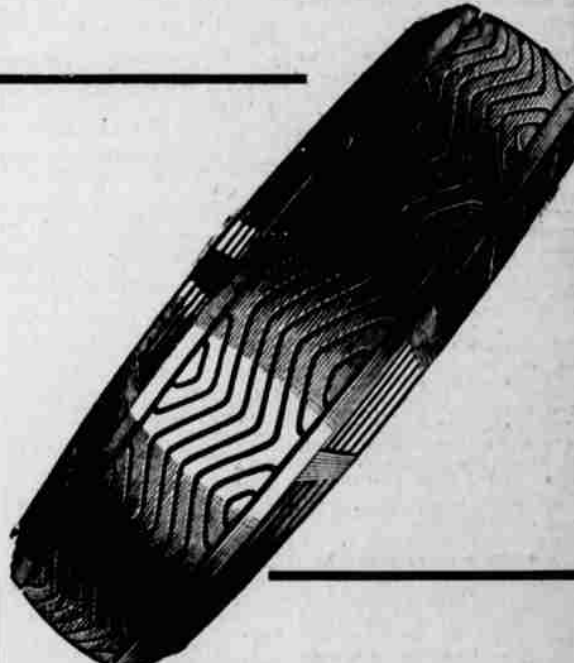
