

AIR-BORNE OUTFIT WILL BE FIRST IN AMERICAN ARMY

Small Autos, Motorcycles
And Bicycles Will Be Carried
By New Battalion.

Washington, Sept. 19.—(AP)—Plans for organization of the army's first air-borne infantry battalion, which will be equipped with small automobiles, motorcycles, and bicycles, were announced today by the war department following months of experimental work.

The new battalion will be organized at Fort Benning, Ga., October 10 with an initial strength of 500 volunteers, including 50 from Fort Bragg, N. C., and 450 from Camps Croft, S. C., and Wheeler, Ga.

Disclosure of the plans came at a press conference held by Secretary of War Stimson at which it also was announced that hereafter officers of national guard units may be assigned to non-national guard outfits whenever it is desirable.

Far Reaching Step

This step was regarded as one of the most far reaching yet taken toward merging national guard organizations complete into the broader structure of the army. It means that regular and reserve officers will be assigned to command guard troops as well as that guard officers may command other troops. In connection with this change the department said that guard officers no longer would be promoted without regard to the length of service prior to promotion.

Another announced change affecting the guard was that guard enlisted men returned home in keeping with the army's intention of releasing as many men as possible in the next few months would be carried on the rosters of their state detachments so that they would not become subject to the draft even though of draft age.

CHINESE BUILD UP HOSPITAL STAFFS

Hongkong.—(P)—The Chinese Friends of the Wounded society, which boasts 3,000,000 members in China, the United States and elsewhere, is scanning the ranks of young educated Chinese in Hongkong for recruits to its large army of men and women serving in field hospitals and hygienic stations near China's multiple battle lines.

There are more than 25,000 hospital workers attached to the national headquarters in Chungking. Smaller staffs are maintained by 80 branch societies throughout free China.

The Salvation Army, the New Life Movement association and the Chinese Red Cross help the

society's work, which ranges from nursing and dietetics to delousing, laundering and sewing buttons on a soldier's tough tunic.

Spokane, Sept. 19.—(P)—A Spokane business men's committee raising \$110,000 to pay for the site of the \$14,000,000 air corps supply and repair depot which will be built near Gelger field had less than \$20,000 yet to raise today.
