VAN WINKLE SAYS SCHOOLS OUTSIDE NEW BUDGET LAW

Salem, Sept. 20.—(P)—A special 1941 legislative act shifting municipal corporations' fiscal year from a January 1 to a July 1 starting point as of 1942 does not affect the taxing power of school districts whose customary fiscal year does not coincide with the calendar this year, Attorney General I. H. Van Winkle ruled today.

School districts of Lane county through District Attorney William W. Bartle had asked Van Winkle if a provision of the 1941 law limiting tax levies for the first half of 1942 to a three per cent increase, in effect, to them.

The attorney general held that where school districts' new levies must necessarily cover

expenses incurred before the end of 1941, because of the fiscal year basis on which they have been operating, their 1942 tax

could be increased by the full six per cent permitted by the state constitution.

The new fiscal year law does not affect the right of the people to vote a levy in excess of three per cent for the first half of 1942, Van Winkle also held, in reply to another question propounded by Bartle.

ROOSEVELT SIGNS RECORD TAX BILL

Hyde Park, Sept. 20.—(P)—President Roosevelt today signed the \$3,553,400,000 tax bill, the largest ever enacted. He affixed his signature at 8:15 a. m. (PST).

Designed to help defray the multiplying costs of the national defense and the lease-lend program, the legislation is expected to lift federal revenues above the \$13,000,000,000 mark next year.

Even that total, however, would be only slightly more than half of the estimated expenditures for the current fiscal year and would fail to carry out Secretary Morgenthau's recommendation that government spending be financed two-thirds from taxes and one-third from borrowing.

To further increase federal revenues, another tax bill may be proposed later this fall or early next year.
