It may be that in these days you think of your senator or your congressman as a politician, intent only upon getting at the next election more votes than anybody else can get and so being returned to his very desirable \$10,000 a year job in Washington.

To an extent, of course, you will be right in so thinking. It is a very desirable job. Much honor goes with it. At the present moment in history, Washington is the center of the world. Whole nations rise or fall, realize or fail to realize their aspirations, practically live or perish, according to the decisions that are made here.

In our own United States of America, communities thrive or languish according to these same decisions.

Washington is a fascinating city to live in. It is ten times MORE FASCINATING to live in Washington and PLAY A PART in the decisions that are being made here every day. It is little wonder that sena-

tors and congressmen want to come back.

GROCERYMEN live by selling groceries. Drygoods men live by selling drygoods. Senators and congressmen live by SELLING THEMSELVES and their merits to their constituents.

That is why they are politicians. They have to be or lose their jobs.

BUT if you think of your senators and your congressmen only as politicians, you are missing a very important point. They are also your business representatives in Washington.

And Washington is the COUNTRY SEAT of the United States of America.

Almost every community has business of importance in Washington these days. Very, very many citizens indeed have business in Washington.

For all of these, communities and individuals alike, senators and congressmen are the go-betweens, the men who know the ropes, who know whom to see and how, who smooth the way for the people back home who come here for one reason or another and don't know their way around after they get here.

SUPPOSE, for example, you have come to Washington on necessary business with one or more of the multifold government departments, or to attend one or more of the unbelievably numerous "hearings" with which business men and citizens generally are increasingly concern-

ed. Suppose, as a part of the picture, you are one of vast majority that doesn't know the ropes and is more or less lost here.

In that event, you go first to your senator or your congressman. He or his secretary will listen to your business. If it is sound and legitimate business, he will interest himself in it and do what he can to carry it through to a successful conclusion.

He will MAKE APPOINTMENTS for you to see the people (connected with the government) whom it is necessary for you to see. It is just barely possible (although generally the government people whom you have to see are generous with their time) that you might have trouble in getting favorable appointments, if left entirely on your own resources, to see those whom you need to see.

But if an important senator or congressman makes the appointment for you, your path is smoothed unbelievably. The trifling little obstacles are cleared away by such an introduction and you are assured of a courteous and attentive interview.

After that, of course, it is up to you.

WHAT is here said refers to those who come to Washington to transact business with the government. For each citi-

zen who has business with his government that is important enough to warrant the time and expense involved in a trip to the nation's capital, there are thousands whose business is of such a nature that it must be conducted by mail, or by telephone and telegraph.

For all such, senators and congressmen are business agents.

By mail or by telephone or by telegraph they familiarize themselves with the business of the constituent and then do their best to get it taken care of to his satisfaction.

In this connection, keep in mind the very important distinction that the constituent is the CUSTOMER and friend of the senator or the congressman whereas the government employee or department head or what have you is apt to be someone who means little in the legislator's life.

It is for this highly important reason that your senator or your congressman is apt to be a very EFFICIENT representative for you. He is ON YOUR SIDE.

IF you will keep in mind these significant facts in regard to your representative in the congress of the United States, you will be in a more intelligent position to vote when the next senatorial or congressional election comes around.
