

## YEAR OLD SKY BOX FOUND NEAR SHORE FOUR-MILE LAKE

A radiosonde dated August 26, 1940, was found on the ground beneath a tree east of Four-Mile lake last Sunday by Ray Gueches, Bellinger Lane, Griffin Creek district, Mrs. Gueches reported today.

Mr. Gueches found the little box, used in gathering meteorological data at high altitudes, while he was on a hunting trip. He was attracted to it by its parachute strings which dangled from the tree, Mr. Gueches related. He was to mail the box today to the weather bureau at Washington, D. C., as directed by a tag attached to the radiosonde. One dollar is paid for return of the boxes.

Outside of the box was badly deteriorated, the batteries were corroded and the writing on the tag was faded but the instruments themselves appeared to be in good condition, Mr. Gueches related.

W. J. Hutchinson, chief of the weather bureau here, said that recovery of several old radiosondes has been reported recently by hunters, adding that many are usually found in remote parts of the forests in the hunting season. He said he was informed that an Ashland man whose name was not procured

had found one of the boxes dated August 19, 1940, and had left it at Medford postoffice for mailing to Washington. He added that he had been told of others who had found old boxes recently and that the Seattle and Portland weather bureau offices had written to him that they had received inquiries from persons who had found radiosondes sent up from the weather bureau here.

Population of the camp has dwindled to about 160 as families leave to work in the potato harvest in Klamath county.
