PEACH, APRICOT SPRAY ADVISED

All peach and apricot trees should be sprayed with a 5-5-50 bordeaux mixture by October 5, according to C. B. Cordy, assistant county agent.

This spray is for control of peach leaf curl and peach blight or shot hole fungus on apricots.

One-fourth pound of spreader or one quart of summer oil emulsion is advised for each 100 gallons of spray. The oil will stick the bordeaux to the trees for a longer period through the winter.

If this spray is thoroughly applied, no further spraying will be necessary until the pink bud stage next spring, Mr. Cordy said.

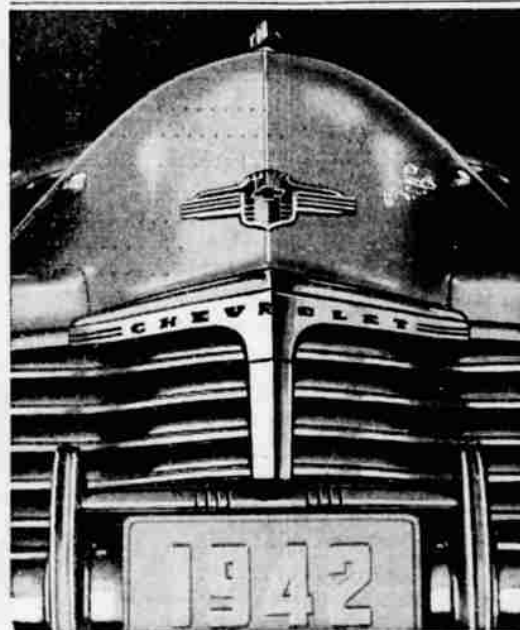
