

NAVAL AVIATION RECRUITERS TO BE HERE OCT. 13

A naval aviation cadet selection board will spend October 13 and 14 here to interview eligible young men interested in becoming

ing naval reserve aviators, Jack M. Carpenter, navy recruiter here, announced today.

The board will be composed of Lieut. Joe R. Forkner and Lieut. (Dr.) William M. Davidson. Headquarters will be in the Hotel Jackson, office hours 9 a. m. to 3 p. m.

To be eligible for cadet training, candidates must be between 20 and 27 years old, physically fit, unmarried and citizens of the United States. In addition they must have attended college for at least two years or long enough to have acquired half the credits to graduate with a degree.

At the successful completion of the training course, which lasts about six months or so, cadets are commissioned to spend about three years with the navy, Carpenter explained. During this time their pay amounts to as much as \$245 a month, with a bonus of \$500 for each year of their commissioned service after they have been returned to an inactive duty status. For those aspiring to a career as pilots in civil aviation, there is afforded an opportunity that cannot be obtained elsewhere to acquire a comprehensive training and aviation background, Carpenter declared.

Eligible candidates were invited to confer with Carpenter at his office in Medford federal building for appointments with the selection board.
