

LOCAL MACHINISTS AFTER CONTRACTS IN DEFENSE WORK

Owners of machine, sheet metal and woodworking shops in Jackson county will meet at the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce at 7:30 p. m. Monday to pave the way for receiving contracts for the manufacture of parts needed in the nation's gigantic defense production program.

Plans will be made also to send delegates to Portland to see a mobile government exhibit of all the parts and articles that can be made in small shops. The special train carrying the display will be in Portland November 24 with government engineers present to explain the procedure to be followed in procuring contracts for the manufacture of the things exhibited, it was stated by Frank Hull, county civilian defense coordinator and manager of the chamber of commerce.

It is the government's aim, Mr. Hull emphasized, to keep the nation's small shops and factories busy in defense production and to give them priority for procuring materials for continued operation.

Diamond Flynn, chairman of the chamber of commerce industries committee, will preside at Monday's meeting. He recently went to the Federal Reserve bank in San Francisco to procure specific information on priorities and how to get small defense contracts. Glenn L. Jackson, chamber of commerce president, will present the general background of the national defense production program.

Housewives Avoiding Over-Buying of Food

New York, Nov. 7.—(AP)—"The housewife is not hoarding food-stuffs to the extent industry and government feared she might," A. C. Nielsen, Chicago merchandise consultant, told members of the Associated Grocery Manufacturers of America at their convention today.

Nielsen estimated that about 16 per cent of America's consumers were buying more than the normal food requirements but said "this figure is a surprisingly low one."

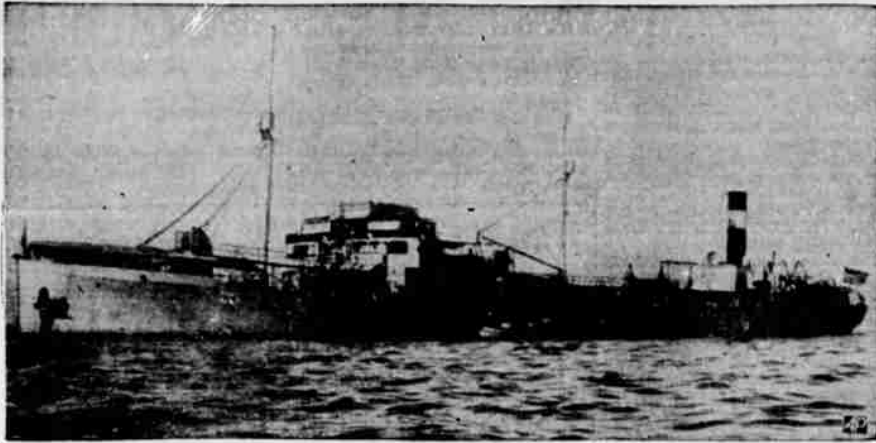
