

FORMER MEDFORD MAN ADVANCES IN TELEPHONE RANKS

Howard J. Boyd, well known in Medford when he was with the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company here from 1922 to 1928, was appointed general personnel supervisor and secretary of the Employees' Benefit Committee of the Oregon area, effective November 1, according to word received by R. H. Hammond, telephone manager here.

Boyd succeeds James Redman, recently named assistant to the general manager for the Oregon area.

With the Bell system for 26 years, Boyd was a technical man in Medford from August, 1922, to September, 1928. He began his telephone career in the employ of the Northwestern Bell Telephone company in Duluth, Minn., in 1916, at the age of 15, as a stock clerk. Six years later he was transferred to Medford, to remain until 1928 when he was transferred to Eugene as senior central office repairman. In July, 1929, he went to Portland as a chief toll test-boardman. Early in 1933 he was transferred to The Dalles as wire chief. In 1936 was named wire chief at Astoria, and in 1938 was transferred to Klamath Falls as wire chief, a position he held until July of this year. At that time he was named staff assistant in the administration department in Portland.

NAVY PROMOTES MEDFORD OFFICER

Washington, Nov. 7.—(P)—The navy has announced promotion of 463 lieutenants to the rank of lieutenant commander. The list included: Frederick F. Agens, Medford.

Lieut.-Com. Agens is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick T. Agens of 232 Valley View Drive and a nephew of Mr. and Mrs. C. M. Kidd of 1820 Crown Hill road.

Lieut.-Com. Agens visited his parents and his uncle and aunt here for a few days last month upon his return from Asiatic duty. For three years he had served on the Black Hawk, a destroyer then on duty in Chinese waters as flagship of the Asiatic fleet. After his visit here Lieut.-Com. Agens left for the Atlantic coast where he will be on duty for the next two years. He is a graduate of the Annapolis Naval Academy.

ASHLAND'S MILK PRICE TO RISE

Ashland, Nov. 7.—(Spl.)—The price of milk in Ashland will rise one cent per quart, effective Monday, Nov. 10, a representative of the dairymen announced Thursday.

The rise was agreed upon at a meeting of the Ashland Dairymen's association Monday evening. Previously, E. B. Poyer had represented the milkmen at a meeting with Oregon milk control board officials in Medford, to voice the local request for a rise in price.

Cost of supplies, feed, etc., was listed as need for the increase in price, which will be extended on all quantities of a quart or more.

No change is anticipated in the price of pints, on which the present price is seven cents.

Special Occasion Next Sunday For Methodist Church
