

WAXEY GORDON OF BOOTLEG FAME IS GIVEN BRUSH-OFF

San Francisco Judge Tells
Former Jersey Beer Oper-
ator to Get Out, Stay Out.

San Francisco, Nov. 7.—(AP) Waxey Gordon, who made millions in the lush, loose days of prohibition in New Jersey beer operations grabbed a plane out of here today just after a judge had cautioned him "I don't want to see you back here next week."

Gordon is trading in another kind of liquid now. He said he came to San Francisco with his business associate, Albert Mayer, of Philadelphia, to try to interest capital in promotion of a cleaning fluid.

Not Wanted
Police found them at a hotel and booked them on vagrancy charges. In municipal court this morning Judge Clarence Morris continued the case on condition the two get out of town. "The climate here is not good for men

like you," Judge Morris cautioned. "The police don't want you here and I don't want to see you back here next week."

So Gordon and Mayer caught the noon United Airliner for Los Angeles. They will head for the east coast tomorrow, they said.

The prohibition era brewery operator—he quite cheerfully identified himself—and his associates were discovered yesterday at a fashionable hotel, and taken off to police headquarters on vagrancy charges.

Seeking Bankroll
There Gordon explained his mission to the far west. "I came out here to get a bankroll," he told Inspectors Frank McCann and William McMahon.

"What I mean is, I came out here to interest capital in a wonderful cleaning fluid which I will market as soon as I get finances to set up a company," he elaborated.

With Gordon when he was picked up were two men the inspectors identified as Albert Mayer, 50, of Philadelphia, and Joe Bernstein, 45, San Francisco. All were released on \$100 bail each.
