

LATIN AMERICA LOOKS TO U. S. FOR ARMAMENT

Washington, D. C.—(UP)—Definite steps toward modernization of the armed forces of many American republics at last seem to be under way.

Although many of the countries, especially the larger ones of South America, have sizeable well-trained forces of military reserves, through their traditional policies of compulsory military service, their equipment and material have not kept pace with the development and practices of modern warfare. Military conditions in those countries, in this sense, are analogous to that existing in the United States before the present armament program began.

Rearming of the countries of Latin America has been highlighted during the past several

weeks by these developments:

1—Gen. Eduardo T. Lapez and Rear Admiral Saba H. Suero, of Argentina, soon will leave for the United States to open negotiations for military and naval equipment and material. More than \$100,000,000 has been appropriated for military and naval armament by the Argentine congress.

2—Uruguay has been granted a loan of \$17,000,000 under the Lend-Lease Act to buy military equipment in the United States.

3—Mexico has ordered 160 military planes from the United States, and has indicated that other equipment also will be sought.

4—A credit has been arranged in Washington by the government of Haiti for armament purchase.

Military, naval and aviation

missions from the United States are stationed in Argentina, Brazil, Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, Paraguay, Peru, Ecuador, Haiti, Guatemala, El Salvador, Venezuela and Nicaragua.

In addition, virtually all Latin American republics have taken advantage of invitations from the war department, and have sent junior officers to serve with active units in various arms and at service schools.

ENGLAND GETTING PLANES MADE FOR M'CHORD AIRBASE

Northwest Field Is Without Ships As Boeing Bombers Are Flown To Britain.

McChord Field, Wash. (AP)—This \$11,000,000 army air base, the largest in the Pacific northwest, paradoxically lacks only one type of equipment necessary for its operation—some planes.

McChord field lost most of its planes early this summer when the old 17th bombing group was split three ways. The parent organization went to Pendleton, the 47th to Fresno, and the 12th remained here.

But the 12th bombing group, designated as one of the air corps' new light attack forces, has no planes. The group is supposed to be equipped with the fast new B-20-B's, which are being produced at the Boeing plant in Seattle.

Ferry Command
Air corps officials say the planes are coming to McChord all right, but only for the ferry command to Britain. The planes leave immediately as Britain's

famous and favorite DB-7's—known as a light attack bomber. Most of the 2,500 men at McChord are engaged in keeping a few outdated B-18's in the air and preparing the field for a future date when it will be one of the busiest in the northwest.

Troops of the 44th base group can be seen from the state highway, practicing with camouflage anti-aircraft batteries (machine guns covered with foliage), and other phases of field training.

New Building

Men are being sent home after serving a year in the air corps if they are 28 years or over, and the ranks are being filled with semi-trained recruits from eastern replacement centers.

The field soon will see the start of an administration building—a two-story affair with a basement, to be located across the street from the present barracks building, now being used partly as a headquarters.
