here, before February 15, 1942, must be in triplicate, typewritten, double spaced, or in ink on one side of 8 1/2 by 11 inch paper. Students name, age and full address must be sealed in a blank envelope and firmly attached to the essay. Students must accompany essay with a statement by his teacher written on official school stationery and sealed in the above mentioned envelope, to the effect that, to the best of her knowledge, the essay is original.

Essays will be judged on knowledge of subject, originality and style. National prizes of \$100, \$75, \$50 and \$25 will be awarded, as well as state prizes of \$7.50, \$5 and \$2.50 and a local prize of \$2.50 in defense stamps.

Laborite Demands Second War Front To Relieve Russia

London, Nov. 14.—(P)—A renewed demand that Britain form a second fighting front to aid Russia, with emphasis on the possibilities of Libya, was sounded in parliamentary debate today by Laborite Emanuel Shinwell, who has been among the critics mentioned as a possible recruit for the British cabinet.

"Why has the offensive in Libya been delayed?" Shinwell demanded. "It has been expected many months."

"It would in effect have created a second front. It would certainly have distracted the Nazis and created difficulties for them. Let the government answer that question."

"Next week or next month an offensive in Libya may not be as effective."

AMERICAN PLANES INFERIOR TO R.A.F.

Kansas City, Nov. 14.—(P)—American-built combat planes don't approach the British Spitfires or Hurricanes, in the opinion of 22-year-old Jonnie Ezzell, home from five months convoy and fighter duty with the RAF.

"The Spitfire is the most magnificent and effective fighting plane yet built," said the young pilot officer, injured in a take-off crash in Scotland last June. He is on three months leave.

We did our fighting at altitudes which would seem unbelievable over here. When you're up against a German fighter which is as good as yours, it's a matter of who climbs faster and higher."
