ROBERT BENCHLEY WITH OSA MASSEN IN SPARKLING HIT

Ravishing Rita In Dance Routines—Cole Porter's Lyrics Are Featured.

As star-spangled as the flag itself, "You'll Never Get Rich" brings Rita Hayworth to the Craterian theatre today for a three-day showing in what has been hailed as the most spectacular musical extravaganza ever filmed by Hollywood. Cole Porter's singable, swingable new lyrics provide tuneful background to the film, considered the year's mightiest bombardment of girls' gags and gaiety. Miss Hayworth's position as Astaire's dancing and romantic partner has been called, by both critics and fans, as an example of plain common-sense, albeit "inspired," casting. The young star, one of the most glamorous in Hollywood today, made her motion picture debut as a dancer, after she had won international fame on the concert and theatre stage under the name of Cansino. Temporarily abandoning her terpsichorean efforts in order to establish herself as an actress, Miss Hayworth currently returns to terpsichore with the world's most famous dancer as her twinkling co-star. The net result is said to be a grand new fame for both brilliant stars.

BABY BORN EVERY 14 SECONDS, SAY CENSUS FIGURES

Washington, Nov. 22.—(The Special News Service)—Census bureau officials say the United States is experiencing the greatest boom in baby production since 1921.

Latest statistics show that the stork is making a new delivery every 14 seconds.

Provisional estimates show that approximately 2,500,000 babies will be born this year to a population of approximately 132 million persons. That represents about 187 babies for every 10,000 persons this year.

In 1937 the birth rate was 171 babies to every 10,000 persons. In 1938 it was 176, and in 1940, 179.

Both the World war and the present defense boom are partially responsible for the latest upswing in the birth rate, says Dr. Philip M. Hauser, the census bureau's assistant chief statistician for population.

"The large crop of babies born after the boys got back from the

World war, have now become old enough to have babies of their own," Dr. Hauser says. "And they are having them."

QUESTION NEVADA WRECK CONFESSOR

Susanville, Calif., Nov. 22.—(AP)—Questioning the "confession" of a young railroad worker that he wrecked the \$2,000,000 streamliner, City of San Francisco, Sheriff Olin S. Johnson arranged to take the man today to the scene of the wreck which killed 24 persons and injured 108.

Thirteen of the crack Southern Pacific passenger train's 17 cars left the tracks near Harney, Nev., on Aug. 12, 1939. An official report of the interstate commerce commission blamed a deliberate plot in which a section of rail was removed.

Johnson identified the section hand as Clarence J. Alexander, 24, Cleo Springs, Okla.

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NAZI ACE FLIER VICTIM OF CRASH

Berlin, Nov. 22.—(AP)—Lieut. Col. Werner Moelders, regarded by Germans as their greatest pursuit airman, was injured fatally today in a crash on his way to the Russian front, Dienst Aus Deutschland announced.

Moelders, credited with 103 air victories, was returning to the eastern front with other officers in a transport plane. Col. Gen. Ernst Udet, who had supervised the development of Germany's fighting planes.

The news service said he died in a hospital but gave no other details.

The black-haired, sharp featured air ace was Germany's youngest lieutenant colonel and the first man to be decorated with the third reich's highest medal for bravery, the "Oak Leaves with Crossed Sabres in Diamonds to the Knights Cross of the Iron Cross."
