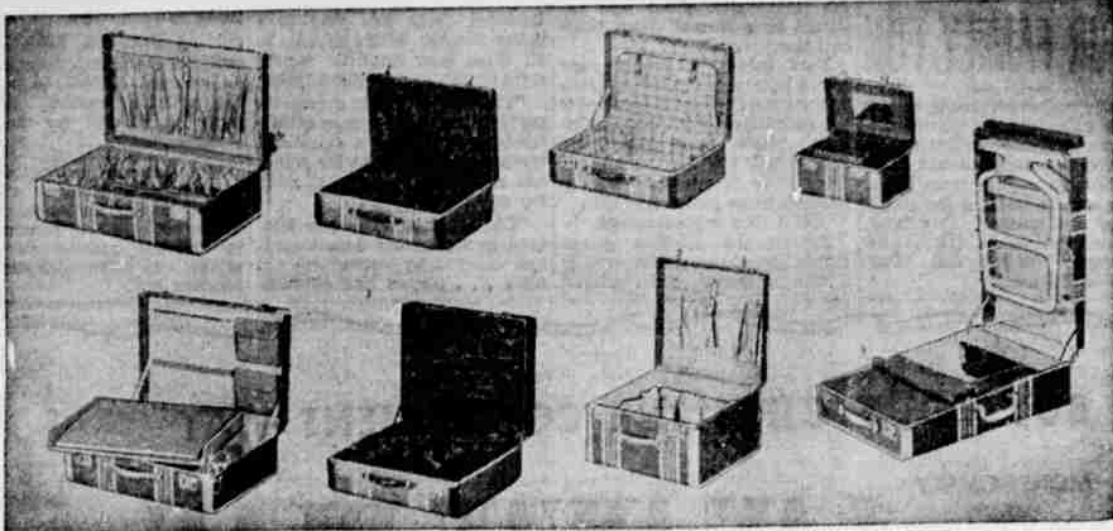


Striped Canvas Luggage Featured at Popular Prices; Luggage Gifts That Fit Every Purse

(With link sausage)

4 tablespoons fat

8 link sausages

1/2 cup buttered crumbs

Heat fat, add onions and simmer

sausages and sprinkle with crumbs.

Bake 25 minutes in moderate oven.

PEACHES TOP LIST OF CANNED FRUIT BOUGHT FOR ARMY

Fort Mason, Cal. (Sp)—Purchase of canned fruit for feeding the army during the current fiscal year ending next June 30 exceed 2523 carloads. This roughly figures at 50 train loads of 50 cars each.

These figures were announced by Col. F. J. Riley, quartermaster supply officer for the San Francisco general depot at Fort Mason and central procurement agent for seven items of canned fruit for the entire army. Non-perishable subsistence which the quartermaster supply officer procures for the army includes canned apricots, cherries, figs, peaches, pears, pineapple, both sliced and crushed, and canned dried prunes. He also purchases canned salmon and canned tuna fish for the entire army but these seafoods are not included in the 50 train loads.

Peaches are the largest item of canned fruit bought for the army and pineapple ranks second according to volume. The total of contracts let for canned peaches to feed the soldiers this year is 350 carloads of No. 10 (1-gal. size) cans and 450 carloads of No. 2 1/2 (1-qt. size) cans. This total of 800 cars would make 16 train loads of 50 cars each.

They were found in a swamp near the village of Olson, where a farmer some time before came upon a case containing three million francs' worth of jewelry while tilling his field. Nobody has yet claimed them.

POST NO BILLS

Charleston, W. Va. (AP)—Bears roaming through West Virginia woodlands have little regard for signs relating to fire prevention, fishing and hunting. Conservation commission officials report that in the Little river section at least 60 posters had been chewed or clawed by the bears. Chief Game Protector H. Prentiss Farley explains that after destroying the signs, the animals "generally use the tree for a rubbing post."

On a cranberry-picking trip with his wife, Willis Jackson came upon the playful puppies, pulling salmon from the riffles of a nearby shallow creek.
