avenue, probably on the bank
corner, Adjutant Cox said. Tins
for coin contributions have
already been placed in stores
throughout the county, he ad-
ded, saying that this year a num-
ber of places requested the
cans.

ior high school.

Part of the cost of the course

will be paid by the state de-
partment and a fee of \$1 will
be charged each one attending.
