

JACKSONVILLE BOY ESCAPES DEATH IN AIR CORPS CRASH

James Eaton Home on Furlough After Experiencing 500-Foot Plunge to Earth

Instead of "going to hell", James Eaton of Jacksonville got a 30-day furlough and came home for a visit.

Young Eaton, who arrived here this morning, survived a plane crash that instantly killed the pilot, a Lieut. Bright, near Lerdo field, Cal., October 12. The two air corps men, after flying in formation in practice drills for about 45 minutes, were coming down from 15,000 feet for a landing. At 500 feet something broke and Bright couldn't level off. The plane continued its breakneck descent, pointed nose downward. Seeing what was happening, Eaton grabbed the radio microphone and shouted into Bright's ear: "Here we go to hell." Bright was too busy trying to pull the plane out to reply. Neither was there time. "The earth came up mighty fast," Eaton said today.

Thrown From Plane
The plane hit with tremendous force and Bright went through the dash board. Miraculously Eaton was thrown clear, being torn out of his safety belt. He didn't know anything for two or three hours. When he woke up he discovered he had only a broken left ankle and an upper lip cut that required 14 stitches to close.

Eaton is the son of Mrs. F. Eaton, former Jacksonville resident now living in Portland, and a brother of Mrs. Ruth Kent of Jacksonville. After a visit with his sister, Eaton plans to continue to Portland to see his mother. He enlisted in the army through the Medford recruiting station last August 5.

RECKLESS DRIVING CHARGED IN CRASH

An automobile accident at West Main street and Oakdale avenue early this morning resulted in a charge of reckless driving being filed by city police against Mrs. Ruth Garrett of 240 South Holly street. She was cited to appear in city court at 10 a. m. December 5.

Police said that Mrs. Garrett's car, traveling east on West Main street, struck the left front fender and side of a machine being driven west on Main street by Owen E. Davis. Marks on the pavement indicated Mrs. Garrett was driving on the wrong side of the center stripe, police said. Nobody was injured, but the front end of Mrs. Garrett's car was badly damaged, as was the left side of Davis' auto.
