

Static Eliminator Developed by "Ham" Who Heard Earhart

Los Angeles, Dec. 5.—(P)—An amateur radio operator who picked up messages from Amelia Earhart on her fateful around the world flight in 1937 has developed his receiver until he claims it is more effective in eliminating static than any now available.

The amateur, Karl E. Pierson, asserted shortly after Miss Earhart's ship was forced down that he had picked up signals from it and now declares he is positive of it.

Pierson said the army signal corps has made tests of the receiver at its Fort Monmouth laboratories at Red Bank, N. J., and has ordered some of them.

Dr. Lee De Forest, sometimes called the father of radio, declared Pierson's receiver eliminates noises far more effectively than any he has seen.

Tuna, Salmon Prices Take Skyward Leap

Astoria, Ore., Dec. 5.—(P)—The American householder is beginning to pay for the fun—and profit—tuna fishermen had last summer along the north-west coast.

Columbia river packers said they were disposing of their packs at \$23 per case of 48 one-pound cans, or \$10 more than the 1940 price. Packers are getting \$12.50 per case for 48 one-half pound cans, an advance of around \$7.50.

Columbia river salmon also is moving at stiff advances. Extra fancy one-pound chinooks bring packers \$4.50 to \$4.60 a dozen compared to \$3.85 a dozen in 1940.

RECIPES THAT CUT MEAT COSTS

As we find them we reprint meat recipes that give you the very tastiest of meat dishes at low cost.

The cheaper cuts of meat are often the best when properly prepared.

Below are two recipes. Either will give you a very fine dinner meat for your family at a cost of but a few cents a portion.

GOULASH

There are many recipes for Goulash, but this provides the very finest—

2 lbs. Boneless Beef Cubes
1 can Del Rogue Tomato Juice
Chili Powder to taste
Salt and Pepper
Vegetables

Brown well beef cubes in bacon fat after rolling in flour. When well browned add can of tomato juice, chili powder, salt and pepper (for higher flavor Kitchen Bouquet optional). Cook to a thick brown gravy.

In separate kettle have some vegetables—carrots, celery and other vegetables as preferred, including potatoes. When vegetables nearly cooked, remove from heat and finish cooking with the meat in the brown gravy. When necessary thin the gravy with the water the vegetables cooked in. Before serving cook to a thick brown gravy.

Serves 8—A balanced vitamin meal.

SWEDISH MEAT BALLS

¼ lb. Ground Beef or 1 lb. beef and ¼ lb. full sage seasoned Pork Sausage.

3 Slices Home Purity Bread

1 egg

2 or 3 tablespoons butter or other fat

1 can Del Rogue Tomato Juice

2 medium size onions

Salt and pepper.

Soak bread in milk, beat the eggs and thoroughly mix the bread, meat, beaten egg, salt and pepper and roll into small meat balls. Roll the balls in flour and brown well in sizzling hot bacon fat, turning until well browned.

Add the tomato juice, the two onions after dicing and cook to a thick brown gravy. Allow to simmer slowly until well cooked, stirring enough to keep meat from sticking to skillet.
