

LIONS CLUB FOR MEDICAL SERVICE BY MEMBERSHIP

While unanimously condemning "socialized" medicine and dentistry, the Lions club at its weekly dinner meeting Wednesday in the Hotel Medford expressed the conviction that voluntary membership in hospital and medical associations should be brought within the reach of every wage-earner as a means of building health for defense of America.

The membership should be for both the worker and his family, the club agreed. The club was of the belief that with such medical and dental services available, in times of national emergency such as this there would be a tremendous decrease in the number of men disqualified because of physical defects for military or naval service or other defense work. These convictions were given expression through a general discussion of the question: "How should we prepare our people for the rigors of war?"

It was explained that the question did not presuppose that the United States was going to war but was intended to bring out how citizens might prepare themselves in case the nation did enter the world conflict.

The club was told that the

principal reasons for the rejection of soldiers were bad teeth and defective eyesight, two deficiencies that were held to be remediable in most instances.

The Lions were also of the belief that men rejected for any curable ailment could well be granted the medical and dental services of army and navy hospitals so that they could be thus made available for defense work.

Ernest Hugill, Westinghouse representative from Portland, entertained with vocal solos to his own accompaniment.

PENITENTIARY TERM GIVEN CHECK FORGER

Lloyd K. Dowler, 24, charged with forgery, entered a plea of guilty in circuit court yesterday and was sentenced by Circuit Judge H. K. Hanna to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years in the state penitentiary.

Dowler, released from prison last July for the same offense after serving two years, forged the name of Henry E. Byers, his employer, to five checks all for \$39.95, and cashed them at local stores. Dowler also received two suspended sentences on check forging charges, District Attorney George W. Neilson said.
