

CAGE JAMBOREE DECEMBER 19 TO DRAW BIG CROWD

Plans Being Made to Accommodate Large Attendance—Five Teams to Perform

Plans were being made today to accommodate a large attendance at the southern Oregon basketball jamboree in the Medford senior high school gymnasium next Friday night, December 19.

Five varsity high school teams will take part in the jamboree, Roseburg, Ashland, Grants Pass, Medford and Klamath Falls. Each team will play the others in a 6-minute contest, thus providing ten 8-minute games all told.

Opening ceremony will be staged at 7:45 and the first game will be played at 8, said Russ Acheson, Medford basketball coach and director of the jamboree.

To Be Annual Event
The southern Oregon basketball jamboree is an innovation and is intended as a regular basketball season prelude which will permit spectators, players, coaches and officials to get acquainted, Acheson said. It will be made an annual event and will be rotated among the participating cities.

Any officials who want to serve in the jamboree were asked by Acheson to get in touch with Jean Eberhart at the Southern Oregon College of Education before Friday. Eberhart is the czar of southern Oregon basketball officiating. Any unregistered officials

Coffman, managing director of the game played each year for the benefit of the Shriners' Hospital for Crippled Children, announced the East squad would train this year on the University of Santa Clara campus.

Fruit Cocktail For Holidays

Somehow the first course for holiday feasts, in fact for any dinner, is apt to be a puzzle. But it shouldn't be—not with Libby's Fruit Cocktail on hand. Canned in sunny California this combination of peaches, pears, tiny white grapes, pineapple, and maraschino style cherries has flavor of merit, and is always ready, smart and appetizing.

Creamy Fruit Cocktail Pie
¾ cup sugar
7 tablespoons flour
1¼ teaspoon salt
2 cups milk
3 egg yolks
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 tablespoon butter
1 No. 2½ can Libby's Fruit Cocktail
1 baked pastry shell

Blend sugar, flour and salt. Heat milk to a scalding. Add to dry ingredients. Cook in double boiler until smooth and thick. Cover and cook 10 minutes longer. Beat egg yolks and add mixture gradually. Return to double boiler and cook 2 minutes. Remove from heat; add vanilla and butter. Drain Fruit

Cocktail and arrange in the bottom of the baked pastry shell. Pour cream filling over the fruits. Top with meringue made by beating 3 egg whites foamy, adding 6 tablespoons sugar and beating stiff. Sweetened whipped cream may be used instead of meringue.

Amount—One 9-inch pie.

Jellied Fruit Salad

Mayonnaise
Salad greens
Drain syrup from fruit cocktail. Dilute with water to make 2 cups liquid. Dissolve gelatin according to directions on package. When cool, add fruit cocktail. Pour into individual molds and allow to set. Unmold on drained pineapple slices. Garnish with greens. Serve dressing separately.

BOWLERS ASKED TO PUT PRIZE MONEY IN BONDS

Milwaukee, Dec. 12.—(AP)—Secretary E. H. Baumgarten of the American Bowling Congress today asked the 18,000 bowling leagues in the national organization to put their league prizes in United States defense bonds and stamps. The A.B.C. has purchased \$15,000 in bonds and plans to convert most of its reserve fund into such securities.
