BERLIN IN DENIAL WAR DECLARATION

Berlin, Dec. 12.—(Official radio received by AP)—Spokesmen at the Wilhelmstrasse declared today that Adolf Hitler's speech yesterday was not a declaration of war against the United States. Technically, they said, it was "nothing else but a statement of facts created by President Roosevelt's aggressive policy"—a "regulation of a condition already existing between the United States and Germany." (Germany's declaration left at the state department yesterday morning by German Charge d'Affaires Hans Thomsen said, "I will not be responsible for bills contracted by anyone other than myself, Harry F. Overbeck.")
