TIN CONSERVATION RULES ANNOUNCED

Washington, Dec. 31.—(AP)—The government today prohibited the use after March 31 of tin in 29 different products—including musical instruments, tinfol, toys, household furnishings, jewelry, buckles and various novelties—and ordered an immediate 50 percent reduction in tin used for such purposes. No new restrictions were placed on tin used in cans and other containers but the OPM priorities division said a conservation order would be issued shortly limiting production and use of those items.
