FINN PEACE HINT GIVEN NEW COLOR

Stockholm, Jan. 7.—(AP)—Rumors that Finland is seeking peace with Russia were given color today by a disclosure that high Finnish officials, including Juhani Paasikivi, former minister to Moscow, had visited Stockholm recently.

Paasikivi's presence here was regarded as particularly significant in some quarters because he headed the Finnish delegation to Moscow which negotiated the peace ending the 1939-40 war between Russia and Finland.

Russian circles here do not deny the possibility of peace talks with Finland, but they say there has been no meeting between Paasikivi and Madame Alexandra Kollantay, Soviet ambassador to Sweden.
