Many Enlisted—From December 8, the day after Japan attacked the U. S. without warning through December 31 the Oregon recruiting district enlisted 1,054 Oregonians in the army, a new record for the state, Sgt. Joseph W. Cushman, commander of the recruiting station at the Medford federal building, stated today. Of the total, the Medford office accounted for 102 enlistments, Sgt. Cushman said. Since the start of the second World war in September, 1939, the average has been 213 enlistments a month, he related, adding that the greatest previous record was established in July, 1940, when the army enlisted 447 from Oregon.

War Bulletins

London, Jan. 13.—(AP)—The admiralty announced tonight a 5,222-ton Italian supply ship had been torpedoed, another axis supply ship of medium size had been set afire by gunfire and an Italian minesweeper sunk by British submarines in the Mediterranean. The admiralty identified the minesweeper as the Santo Peitro, and said the supply ship, the Sirio, was damaged seriously.

Berlin, Jan. 13.—(Official Broadcast recorded by AP)—DNB said today that the British battleship reported by the German high command on Nov. 26 to have been torpedoed by a U-boat off Salum was the 31,100-ton Barham.

New York, Jan. 13.—(AP)—The British command at Singapore announced today that "in western Malaya the withdrawal of our troops to positions in the rear has continued." The communique, broadcast from Singapore, was recorded by CBS.

Rangoon, Burma, Jan. 13.—(AP)—Renewed RAF attacks on Japanese-occupied airfields and a new Japanese raid on the airfield north of Rangoon were announced tonight by army and RAF headquarters.

Rio de Janeiro, Jan. 13.—(AP)—The German consulate was reliably reported today to be burning its papers. Informants linked this with information that Brazil, with other Latin American nations, is willing to sever diplomatic relations with the axis.

London, Jan. 13.—(AP)—A daylight raider dropped bombs near a northeast coast town today, killing six persons, four of whom were women. Several other were injured seriously. Fighters chased the raider away.

APPLICATIONS FOR TIRES TOMORROW

Eligible persons may receive applications for the purchase of tires and tubes from the tire rationing board at the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce tomorrow morning. It was announced after a board meeting this afternoon. Later, the board said, the applications may be obtained directly from tire dealers. After the application has been filled out, it must be approved by the board before a tire may be issued to the applicant. Jackson county's quota for January is 56 tires and 47 tubes for passenger cars and light trucks and 137 tires and 115 tubes for trucks and busses. The board will meet at 7:30 p. m. Friday in council chambers on the top floor of city hall. All authorized tire dealers were urged by the board to attend as regulations and the set-up of inspectors will be explained in detail.
