

PHONE COMPANY ISSUING AGENTS FOR BOND SALE

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company is being empowered by the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco to act as an issuing agent for U. S. defense bonds being purchased by its employees under the payroll allotment plan, according to word received by R. B. Hammond, manager here.

In an official announcement, N. R. Powley, president of the company, said:

"Our resources, facilities and personnel are all directed toward our company playing its full, effective and patriotic part in this great national emergency. We count it not only a real privilege, but also an honor to be of service to our government in acting as its issuing agent for the United States defense savings bonds. Further, this arrangement we are placing in effect—and the same is true of all large employers who become an issuing agent—will lighten the load of the Federal Reserve Banks and other selling agents who have been swamped with orders."

"In August, 1938, arrangements were made for the purchase of United States savings bonds by payroll allotment. On May 1, 1941, this plan was amended to make provision for the purchase of the United States defense savings bonds. Our employees' experience with the payroll allotment plans heretofore adopted, which they both appreciate and used extensively, has been a most helpful background in their patriotic purchase of the defense savings bonds. As at December 31, 1941, 6,217 employees were participating in the plan and had purchased or were purchasing, at the end of the year, \$1,433,475 face value of bonds.

"Since the tragic events of December 7, 1941, there has been a marked increase in the purchase of defense bonds by our employees through the use of this attractive payroll allotment plan. In our having the privilege to act as an issuing agent for the defense bonds it will, of course, add to the already heightened interest of our employees in their patriotic purchase of these bonds and, without doubt, this additional step we are taking will be as enthusiastically received as has been our popular payroll allotment plans."
