Los Angeles, Jan. 21.—(AP)—Private funeral services, with only intimate friends present, were arranged for 4 p. m. (PST) today, in the church of the recessional, Forest Lawn Memorial Park, Glendale, for Screen Star Carole Lombard and her mother, Mrs. Elizabeth K. Peters.

The bodies, recovered from the Nevada mountain top where a commercial airliner carried 22 persons to their deaths last Friday night, were taken from a train at Pomona this morning and transported by hearse to the cemetery.

A spokesman for Miss Lombard's husband, Clark Gable, issued a statement, saying: "Miss Lombard and her mother, in their respective wills, requested private burial services, and Miss Lombard, although in public life, wanted only her family and closest friends in death."
