Japs Say MacArthur Has Three Lines



A Domei news agency dispatch from the Japanese army in the Philippines said that General MacArthur's forces had drawn up these three main lines of defense across Batan peninsula (1), a first line from Abucay on Manila Bay to Mt. Natib, south of Alonsgapo; (2), a second line based on fortified positions a few miles south; and (3), a third line across the peninsula in the Mariveles mountains on a few miles from the southernmost tip of Batan.
