

Fresh Fruit Growers Urge Internment of West's Enemy Aliens

Belleair, Fla., Jan. 23.—(AP)—The United Fresh Fruit and Vegetable association today asked for immediate internment of all enemy aliens in Arizona, California, Oregon and Washington to forestall violence between Japanese and Filipino produce farm labor on the Pacific coast.

The association adopted a resolution which also called on the treasury department to impound all funds and business properties owned by the aliens in the west coast states.

"We feel that, unless such steps are taken promptly and effectively, the efforts of state and local law enforcement officers to maintain peace and order may be unavailing, which would undoubtedly react unfavorably toward our own nationals who are now interned in axis countries," the resolution said.

State Buys Land in Salem Vicinity for Feeding of Inmates

Salem, Jan. 23.—(AP)—Purchase of 416 acres of river bottom land six miles west of Salem was announced by Governor Charles A. Sprague today, who said the land would be used for growing food for state institutions.

The purchase price was \$60,000. Land bought was: 151 acres, Steiner and Evans property, \$25,000; 95 acres, Mrs. B. O. Schucking property, \$14,000; and 160 acres, Hugh Nelson property, \$21,000.

Since the 1941 legislature appropriated only \$50,000 for this purpose, the state was forced to trade 35 acres of land, north of D street just outside of Salem, to Nelson.

SHIPBUILDING HAS EDGE ON SINKINGS

Washington, Jan. 23.—(AP)—Chairman Land of the maritime commission has told congress that construction of allied shipping is now forging ahead of losses by sinkings at sea and that the United States has "the world licked right now" on standard cargo ships and tankers.

Reporting on the progress of the program for a vast merchant marine before a house appropriations subcommittee in testimony made public today, Land asserted:

"The last time I looked at the curves, the sinkings and the new production were just about balanced for the first time during the war, and now new construction is getting ahead."

GIRL FLIER FIRST FOR CIVIL PATROL

Spokane, Jan. 23.—(AP)—The first person in the state of Washington to receive a certificate of authorization for civil air patrol duty was a girl and Washington girls have completed formation of the first all-girl civil air squadron in the United States, the wing command headquarters announced here today.

The girls receiving her certificate was Cella M. Hunter of Everett, executive officer Gwin Hicks, disclosed. Miss Hunter's certificate arrived with three others today, including that of L. H. Hubert of Tacoma and two Spokane men.

264,533 Found Jobs By State Service

Salem, Jan. 23.—(AP)—The state employment service found jobs during 1941 for 264,533 persons, a new record and a gain of 91,709 over the previous year, the service said today.

Farm work accounted for 146,886 of the jobs, an increase of 37,421.

The Portland office led with 72,853 placements. Next were Salem 36,604, Pendleton 23,491, Klamath Falls 15,038, Eugene 12,472, and Medford 11,447.

Cle Elum, Wash., Jan. 23.—(AP)—Gerald Strobe of Yakima was killed and 26 others injured when an automobile skidded into a Washington Motor Coach company bus two miles west of Easton late yesterday afternoon.

FREIGHTER SINKS

New York, Jan. 23.—(AP)—The third naval district announced today that the Clyde-Mallory freighter Brazos, 4,479 tons, had sunk Jan. 13 after a collision off the southern U. S. coast. Identity of the other ship was not revealed. All 35 of the crew were saved.
