

# ATOM SMASHER IS HELD BENEFICIAL AS CANCER CURE

### Cyclotron Rays Are Latest Hope In Treating Disease—Three-Year Test Made

San Francisco, Cal. (U.P.)—After being used three years in experimentation on 153 cancer patients with radiation created by the cyclotron of the University of California the atom-smasher has been established as a definite beneficial agent in the treatment of that disease.

This announcement was made before the Radiological society of America by Drs. Robert S. Stone and John C. Larkin, who have been conducting the experiments ever since it was first felt the neutron rays generated by the cyclotron might have a therapeutic value.

Experiments first were tried on rats and other cancer-inflicted rodents until it was known definitely that the rays did break down cancer cells.

Then the experiments began on humans. Only patients accepted were those already regarded as incurable, or those who were not responding to the usual treatments by X-rays, radium, surgery and other methods.

Many Apparently Cured  
Of the 153 patients who were given the new treatment to date, 24 received the therapy from the original 85-ton cyclotron invented by Prof. O. Lawrence, Nobel prize winner.

They were not included in the final report on the 129 others whose treatment was given by the more powerful 225-ton cyclotron that was built later.

Of these 129, 60 died, but the other 61 are still living and many of them apparently free of the disease.

No Cure-All  
The two scientists emphasized that the treatment is not to be regarded as a cure-all for cancer, but that there is every reason to hope that it will prove more beneficial than the X-ray, the most powerful anti-cancer weapon to date.

The treatment consists of subjecting the patient to radiation that penetrates diseased tissues. This consists of a neutron ray or beam of atomic particles that are generated when the cyclotron is smashing up other atoms. This ray produces a marked shrinking of the tumor and eventually kills the diseased cells. It is also capable of killing other cells that are not diseased.

He has left a friend's home only twice since he brought Miss Lombard's body home Wednesday morning—to attend funeral services for her and her mother, Mrs. Elizabeth K. Peters, that afternoon, and services for his friend and publicity man, Otto Winkler, yesterday.

"You've got to find something to occupy your time; something to do with your mind besides brood," friends told him.

So Gable agreed to go ahead with the picture on which he had done one day's work—"Somewhere I'll Find You." He didn't set the date and the studio didn't ask him to.

"We will wait until Gable feels that he is mentally and physically able," a spokesman said.

Dr. B. R. Elliott announced today the leasing of Elliott farm to Mr. and Mrs. Victor F. Birdseye, formerly with the Meadowbrook dairy near Phoenix in Jackson county. The Birdseyes will operate under the name of Elliott Dairy farm, Victor F. Birdseye, proprietor. Mr. and Mrs. Birdseye and two children Mary Ann and Ted have moved to their new location.
