HOGAN ACQUIRES 4-STROKE MARGIN IN 'FRISCO OPEN
Leader Has Halfway Score of 136—Little and Bassler Second With 140's.

San Francisco, Jan. 26.—(P)—With Benny Hogan still out in front and gallying strongly, the \$5,000 San Francisco open golf tournament seemed to be a "one horse" race today as the field turned to the last half of the 72-hole event.

There was always a chance of a slip-up, especially in the pressure of a double round, but Hogan was the people's choice. The nerveless shotmaker, best when the going is toughest, has carded a 136—eight strokes under par—for the first 36 holes.

Hogan led the first round with a 65, seven under par for the California club course and three two postponements because of rain and the unplayable condition of the course, he came through yesterday with a second round card of 34-37—71 as well as increasing his lead to four strokes.

A step behind as the third round firing opened was Dick Metz of Oak Park, Ill., with a 70-71—141. At 142 were Lloyd Mangrum, Monterey Park, Cal., and Al Zimmerman, Portland, Ore. Zimmerman, incidentally, posted a second round 70 after missing six puts when the ball rolled either around or over the cups to stop on the edges.

The field was cut to the low 51 pros and 11 amateurs after the second round.
