THOMAS S. CLOSE BODY RECOVERED, NAVY TELLS KIN

Former Prospect Youth Who Died in Air Mishap To Be Buried in San Diego.

The body of Thomas S. Close was recovered from the navy plane that plunged into the sea off the North Carolina coast and took Close and seven other men to their death last Friday, the parents, Mr. and Mrs. Claude E. Close of Medford, were notified by telegram last night.

Last Saturday morning Mr. and Mrs. Close received a letter from their son saying he was well and happy in his naval duties in the Norfolk area. A birthday present for his father also arrived from the youth.

Saturday night a telegram came saying their son had been killed. Mrs. Close collapsed and has since been under medical care. Mr. Close, however, was making arrangements today for him and his wife to leave tonight for San Diego, Cal., where funeral services will be held, the navy department having been asked to send the body there. The youth's wife resides in San Diego.

Tommy Close, formerly with the CCC, enlisted in the navy March 16, 1937, and was assigned to naval aviation. He was 20 years old last August 4. He completed his second year in the Prospect high school. His parents formerly resided in Medford. Tommy was born in Pangborn, Ark., and came to southern Oregon with his parents in 1927.

On their way to San Diego the parents are to be joined in Sacramento, Cal., by Mrs. Close's sister, Mrs. Norma Richman. Tommy's brother, Leon "Catey" Close, who has been engaged in defense work at Pensacola, Fla., and was to have joined the navy last Friday, is to meet his parents in San Diego to attend the funeral services.
