EDUCATION BOARD APPROVES RETURN OF MINE DEGREES

Degree Work in Commerce Deferred for Further Study - War Conditions Faced.

Portland, Jan. 28. - (P) - Restoration of degree work in mining engineering at Oregon State college was approved by the state board of higher education here Tuesday, effective with the start of the 1943 fall term.

Action of the accompanying request of the college for restoration of degree work in commerce was "deferred for further study by the committee," as reported by C. A. Brand, chairman of the curricular committee which has had the requests before it since the December meeting.

Meat Wartime Needs... The board also took action to streamline the schedules of the various institutions to meet wartime conditions, and it arrived at what may become a policy on salary raises to meet increased offers from other institutions or private business.

Reestablishment of mining engineering degree work at O. S. C. will be in the form of a department in the school of engineering rather than as a separate school, which was discontinued in the 1932 reorganization. The work was restored at the request of Oregon mining interests.

Course changes for all institutions were approved as recommended by the curricular committee. Most important change was the addition of 348 credit hours at the University of Oregon, most of which are to be put into effect the major work in science recently granted there, effective next fall.

New SOCE Course... The college asked for no credit increases except for the commerce work, which was held for further study, while the colleges of education had new courses in secretarial science at Ashland and La Grande approved.

Under the streamlined schedule the current school year at the University and State college will be shortened by the elimination of spring vacation to permit ending the term by about two weeks. The medical school is authorized to operate on a four-quarter basis starting this summer, and the summer schools at the college and university will be enlarged to meet extra demands that may develop.

Raid on Institutional Staffs... Raids on institutional staffs to take vital men away at increased pay were recognized by the board as a growing problem when Chancellor Hunter reported offers just received by two men in engineering at Oregon State college.

Grant Feikert, chief engineer of KOAC and professor of electrical engineering, was wanted the raise recommended, while a larger increase for William Paul, associate professor in mechanical engineering, was referred to the executive committee.

University of Oregon was authorized to combine the present schools of social science and arts and letters and the new major science departments into a college of liberal arts as recommended by President Erb.

Sentence Waited On Lewd Exposure... Billy Dean Collins, 20, of 413 North Ivy street pleaded guilty in justice of the peace court yesterday to a city police charge of lewd exposure of his person, and Judge William R. Coleman postponed passing of sentence for 10 days for further investigation of the case. The youth was committed to the county jail.

Collins annoyed a woman on the street the night of January 19, police charged. In 1938 he was sentenced to the state training school at Woodburn for bothering girls, the records show.

"SHARE A RIDE"... Wheeling, W. Va. (AP) - A "share a ride exchange" was established by the Wheeling Automobile club today to cope with the curtailment of rubber and automobiles. It is estimated motorists in the Wheeling area will save \$150,000 a year.

Axis Attempting Vast Triple 'Squeeze' Play Is MacKenzie's Belief

From the battle amidst the swirling sandstorms of the great Libyan desert, eastward to the fierce struggle in the wet heat of the Malayan jungle north of Singapore, is better than sixty-five hundred miles as the crow would fly if he were silly enough to make the attempt.

One end of that long line, which reaches a quarter way around the globe, has its source in a vital war-spot of the western theater. The other rests on a key position of the allied defense in the new battle of the orient.

It's a far reach between these two scenes of conflict, and it takes a stretch of imagination to realize that they not only aren't wholly separate operations, but are closely and vitally associated as part and parcel of the same world-wide war. They cannot be dissociated or treated as distinct units for military purposes, as many people have been trying to do.

Indeed, so closely are they interlocked that it strikes me we can see in them the beginnings of a grand axis strategy which envisages a vast triple squeeze against the allied defense that stretches from the Mediterranean to the western Pacific.

To be sure, the axis drives at Libya and Singapore are to a degree separate operations in the development of the strategy for the European and the Pacific theater. But they also are to my view the tanks of a great pincers movement, which are calculated to be coordinated in the approaching spring with a German drive down into the Caucasus or the middle east towards the oil and other supplies which Hitler must have to maintain his fighting machine.

Within the claws of this huge crushing-machine, if they could be closed, would lie the resources and military power which would mean victory for the Axis - Egypt, the Suez canal, the middle east, the vast Indian empire, and the Burmese control of the Burma road upon which China is dependent for war supplies. The idea seems on the grandiose side at first glance, but it's not so far-fetched as might appear and there can be no doubt that the Nazis and Japs are working towards that ultimate goal.

Hitler's efforts to maintain a hold on Libya have several strategic reasons back of them, but this chief purpose is to secure a base from which to strike again from the west at Egypt and the Suez canal. This operation would be synchronized with a drive into the middle east, thus creating a pincers movement on Egypt and the canal.

Hitler has been maneuvering to carry out that scheme ever since Italy came into the war and made Libya available as a base. Now the entrance of Japan into the conflict gives a chance to expand the idea and put another claw on the pincers.

Hitler may be expected to strike at Russia again in the spring, and one of his main objectives will be to break down into the Caucasus. If he can't achieve that readily, he may attempt to drive his way through Turkey into the middle east.
