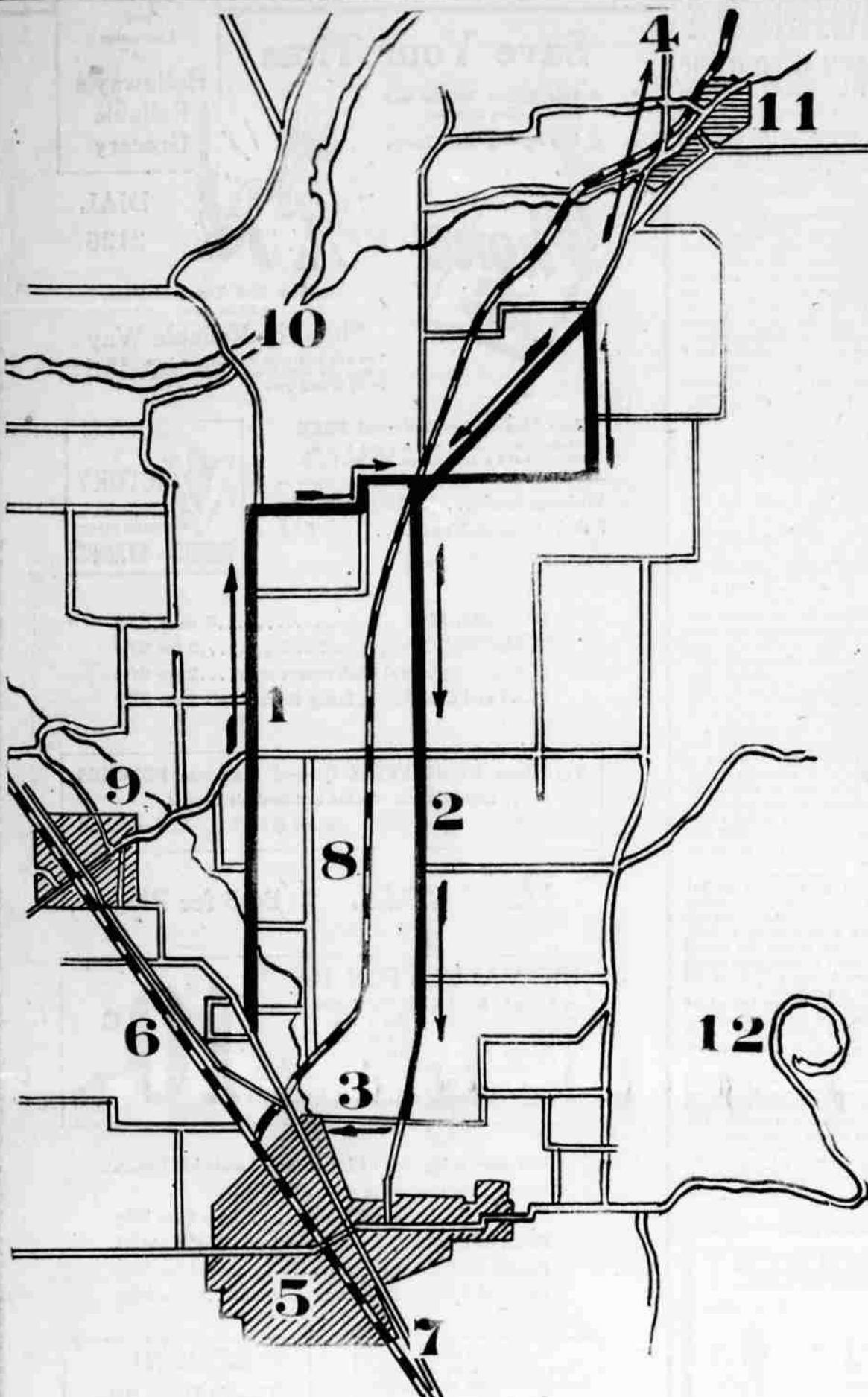


One-Way Traffic Control Effective Saturday Midnight



To facilitate the handling of increased traffic, made necessary by the construction of an army cantonment near this city, roadways indicated in black on the map above have been designated as one-way arterials. This new one-way traffic plan will be put into effect at one minute after midnight Sat. (1) Northbound traffic will be routed on the Midway road, which leaves the old Pacific highway north of the Big Y market, extending to the Wellen road. Cantonment and Eagle Point travel will turn right at the intersection of the Midway and Wellen roads and will continue eastward to the intersection of the Wellen road and the Crater Lake highway. From this point traffic will proceed north to the Crater Lake highway. The Crater Lake highway will be open only to one-way traffic southbound from that point and extending (2) to the intersection with McAndrews road (3) which connects with the Pacific highway at Medford's city limits. From McAndrews road south, Crater Lake highway will be open to two-way traffic. (4) Route north to Crater Lake. (5) City of Medford. (6) Southern Pacific railroad. (7) Pacific highway extending through Medford. (8) Medford Corporation railroad. (9) Central Point. (10) Rogue River. (11) Eagle Point. (12) Roxy Ann drive and Prescott park. Directional signs will be erected to guide motorists and the cooperation of the public is asked in putting the traffic control plan into successful operation. It was suggested that readers cut the map out and save it for future reference.

TYPEWRITERS ON WPB FREEZE LIST

Washington, March 6—(AP)—An order banning sales and deliveries of new and used typewriters was issued last night and became effective today.

Much of the typewriter industry is being converted to war work and a rationing program to conserve the existing machines is expected soon. Meanwhile, the new WPB decree permits delivery of typewriters only if they were in transit at midnight, the time the order went into effect, or if they are being delivered by one dealer or distributor to another.

Those who have rented typewriters must return them to the owners by April 1. Anyone who has only one used typewriter may sell it to someone else.

ALL ABLE-BODIED MAY BE SUBJECT TO HELP HARVEST

Oregon Employment Service Will Send Questionnaires To Men Between 18-65.

Salem, March 7—(AP)—All able-bodied Oregonians will be subject to emergency work in Oregon's harvest, the state employment service said yesterday in announcing it would send questionnaires to all men between the ages of 18 and 65.

Women already have submitted their questionnaires, while all children above the sixth grade in school will be asked to participate.

The agricultural labor shortage was expected to be the most acute in history, since many farm laborers have gone into the armed forces or into defense jobs.

Federal farm security officials announced they would locate temporary camps for transient farm laborers at The Dalles, Marion, Turner, Redmond and Ontario, while another one may be located at Medford.

The harvest season opens late next month and lasts until late November.

Hundred Million Asked For WPA

Washington, March 6—(AP)—President Roosevelt asked congress today for a \$100,000,000 supplementary WPA appropriation to provide work and training for persons displaced from private employment as the result of the national war program.

U.S. Complacency in World at War Worries Dreiser

Indianapolis, March 6—(AP)—Theodore Dreiser says he can't see what has produced in America "this complacency, this attitude that we can monkey around and win" the war.

"We're due for a grand slam in our faces," the novelist said in an interview last night. "I can see no results for our expenditures. I'd like to see us heat up a little." Dreiser said America had laid a procession of goose eggs across the country and "some day they'll hatch into the full realization that we are the greatest race of thumbtweadders on earth."
