HITLER PREPARES SPRING DASH ON BRITAIN, REPORT

London, March 28.—(AP)—The German high command is preparing to "sacrifice 200,000 airborne troops" in a spring smash against British power stations and gasoline dumps, a responsible London observer said today.

"It will not be the sort of invasion the public has learned to expect," he added. "Hitler will see to that. He is still a smart fellow."

If such a force, comparatively small for an invasion, were to damage vital centers, such as power plants and gasoline depots, this informant declared, the German high command would feel the investment in men, transport planes and gliders well worth while.

Information reaching London from the continent supported the

air attack theory, citing three reports:

1. Large numbers of troop-carrying gliders are being made in Netherlands factories.
2. The Paris plant of the Renault works, which was recently bombed by the RAF, is turning out gliders, as well as tanks.
3. Poison gas is being manufactured extensively in German-occupied Belgium.

CRIPPS PLEASED BY INDIA TALKS

New Delhi, India, March 29.—(AP)—Talks with the leaders of various groups in India looking toward a settlement of the Indian problem were described today by Sir Stafford Cripps, special British envoy, as "entirely" satisfactory.

Sir Stafford still has a number of conferences before the British proposals are released for publication Monday.

Referring at a press conference to his interview yesterday with Mohandas K. Gandhi, Sir Stafford said he thought it was "extremely helpful." He expects to see Gandhi again.

"We talked about the weather, Wardha (Gandhi's home), food, health and some other matters," Cripps said.

Chicago, March 28.—(AP)—In a surprise move, the Dairy Products Market association, government financed cooperative, today raised prices paid for butter in the Chicago spot market.

REMINGTON PLANT BLAST KILLS SIX

Bridgeport, Conn., March 28.—(AP)—Six persons were missing, presumably killed after an explosion and fire that demolished today a small brick building of the sprawling Remington Arms company plant, one of the nation's biggest munitions centers.

A company official reported tonight, seven and a half hours after the explosion, that no bodies had as yet been recovered from the wrecked building, but added that a careful check had failed to locate any of the six missing workers, three women and three men, either at their homes or in hospitals.
