AXIS-LOVING ARGENTINA PUT IN U. S. DOG HOUSE

Washington, April 1—(P)—The United States has shut Argentina off from the special economic military and naval aid granted Latin American countries, until such time as she takes her place in the hemisphere front against the axis.

The decision, an authoritative source disclosed yesterday, was in line with a new policy of giving preferential treatment to American republics which have gone to war or severed relations with the axis.
