

## SOUTHERN OREGON LEGION, AUXILIARY WILL PARTICIPATE

However, since announcement of a local observance on that date in which all civic and patriotic organizations will take part, it has been decided to hold the banquet at 6:00 p. m. and to participate in the parade at 7:15 and the mass meeting at the high school field which will follow.

Carson, state department commander; June Valiant, state adjutant; Victor Micelli, commander of district No. 4; Mrs. Polly McInturff, state president of the Legion Auxiliary and others.

### SEASONALITY CLAIMS TO BE RECONSIDERED

Salem, April 3—(AP)—The state unemployment compensation commission announced today that, as a result of recent state supreme court decisions, it would hold a hearing here April 10 to reconsider its seasonality determinations for the years from 1938 to 1941.

Last year 825 firms were designated as seasonal, compared with 493 in 1938. Under the new law effective this year, only 344 firms qualified as seasonal.

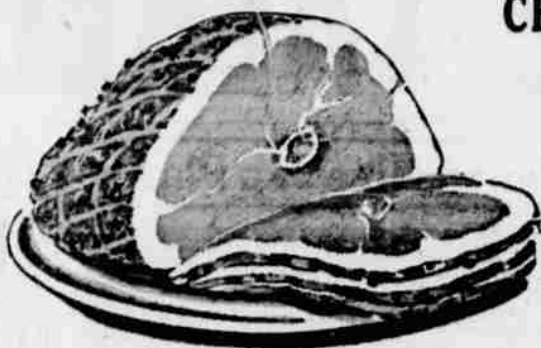
