

## DRAFT EVADERS IN NORTH CALIFORNIA FACE CRACK-DOWN

Arrest of 1,000 Ordered—  
Criminal Prosecution—  
Warnings Not Heeded.

San Francisco, April 3—(AP)—The federal bureau of investigation cracked down hard today on the "careless disregard and wilful violation" of the selective service act and ordered the arrest of 1,000 northern Californians it accused of varied violations.

It was the most hardboiled and widespread action taken in California since the selective service act—then the first peacetime draft law—was passed by congress in 1940.

"Although delinquent registrants have been given numerous warnings in the past to contact their local draft boards to clear up their delinquencies, various draft boards have encountered hundreds of cases wherein there have been either careless disregard or wilful violations of the selective service act," said Nat J. L. Pieper, head of the FBI field office here.

**Many in Bay Area**  
Bulk of the asserted violations were in the San Francisco bay area and in and around Sacramento. Pieper estimated "well over 1,000" complaints would be filed and warrants issued. Under provisions of the FBI plan for national defense, local police were making the arrests. Persons arrested will be held for criminal prosecution in the federal district court.

In previous action against violators of the draft law, steps have been taken against only a few at a time in scattered sections of the state. This is the first time any such large number has been ordered arrested.

### KANSAS SCHOOLS COLD TO JAPANESE STUDENTS

Topeka, Kas., April 3—(AP)—Kansas doesn't want its schools opened to an influx of American Japanese students. Request from west coast schools that these students be sent inland have been rejected by the state board of regents.

Hubert Brighton, secretary to the regents, said the universities of California and Washington had inquired about the transfers.
