

NINTH CORPS AREA HAS NEW LEADER

Fort Lewis, Wash., April 10.—(P)—Major General Kenyon Ashe Joyce, who started army life as a private more than 40 years ago, relinquished command of the 9th army corps and the northwest defense sector today and left for Salt Lake City to take over command of the vital ninth corps area.

His new command includes eight western states and Alaska. Major Gen. Charles H. White, former commander of the 7th infantry division, has been promoted to the command at Fort Lewis.

General Joyce started his military career in 1898 as a member of the First Illinois volunteer infantry and he took part with his regiment in the capture of Santiago, Cuba, in the Spanish-American war.

ADVENTISTS BALK AT JOINING UNION

Eugene, Ore., April 10.—(P)—Several hundred skilled carpenters in the northwest are barred from employment at the Camp Adair cantonment because their religious beliefs are contrary to joining labor unions, Arthur M. Gilbert, Eugene builder, who is a member of the Seventh Day Adventist church and leader of the group, revealed today.

Gilbert said conferences with the contractors in charge of the project revealed that only union men could be employed. Members of the sect have religious scruples against joining labor unions, basing their attitude on "our interpretation of scriptures, making a man's first loyalty to God and our belief that as American citizens we are entitled to keep our beliefs and work," Gilbert added.

HIGHER EDUCATION ENROLLMENT DIPS

Eugene, April 10.—(P)—Enrollment decreased 11.7 per cent for spring term in the six institutions comprising the state system of higher education, a report released by the chancellor's office showed today.

Based on a decrease of eight per cent for fall term and 11 for winter term, officials had anticipated a spring drop of 20 per cent.

Southern Oregon College of Education decreased 4.7 per cent; Oregon College of Education, 9.4; Oregon State college, 10.8; University of Oregon, 14.9 and Eastern Oregon College of Education, 21.7.

CALIFORNIA HAS SURPLUS FUNDS

Sacramento, Calif., April 10.—(P)—For the first time in 10 years California has a cash surplus in its general fund, State Controller Harry B. Riley announced today.

After earmarking \$14,370,000 of the money now actually on hand to repay the amounts borrowed from special funds to enable the state to operate on a cash basis, there is an excess of \$3,061,000 in the general fund, Riley reported.

Remnants of a cash deficiency which only a few years ago reached a total of \$82,000,000 have been wiped out, the controller said. "A surplus of at least \$10,000,000 appears assured within the next few months," he added.

Hold Californians On Rustling Count

Yreka, Calif., April 10.—(P)—Ben Zanotto, 30, employee of the Herman Kurt ranch near Etna, was held in county jail today on a cattle theft charge.

Also held was Orlando Stagno, 27, of Marysville, a licensed cattle dealer, charged with knowingly receiving stolen property. Bail for Zanotto was fixed at \$3,000 and for Stagno at \$2,500.

Runaway, Suicide Hard on Children

Manette, Wash., April 10.—(P)—Kitsap county authorities today cared for three children, 6, 9 and 12 years old, whose mother disappeared Saturday after a family argument, and whose father, Elmer V. Carlson, 37, Puget Sound navy yard joiner, shot himself to death yesterday near the Carlson home. The family came here from Montana last December.

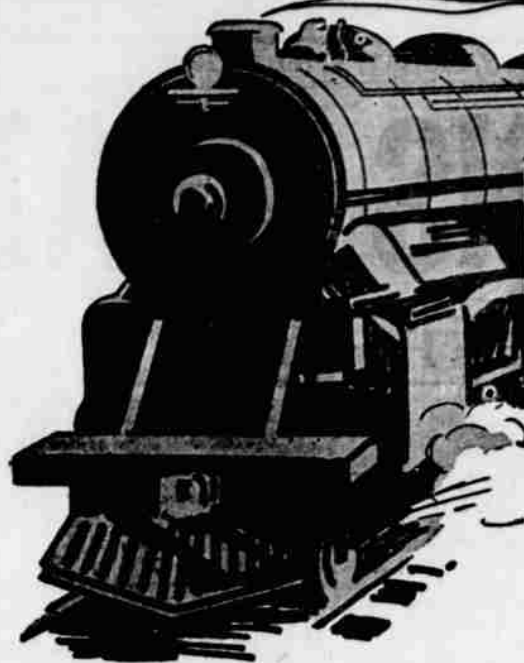
