Corvallis, April 23.—(AP)—Oregon State college today claimed practically a clean sweep of northwest oratorical contests this year with a coast title thrown in for good measure.

Eugene White, Corvallis, won the men's oratory tournament at Linfield college, the state old line contest and the Pacific forensic league competition at Seattle. Harry Thurman, Medford, took top honors in the state peace oratorical contest and the annual College of Puget Sound tournament.

Thurman is the son of Mr. and Mrs. L. B. Thurman of 722 West 14th street and has been particularly outstanding in oratorical contests at Oregon State college this year.

PUBLISHERS GIVE PLEDGE TO F.D.R.

New York, April 23.—(AP)—In the closing executive session of its fifty-sixth annual convention, the American Newspaper Publishers association today adopted a resolution to President Roosevelt pledging "our individual and unswerving support to our commander in chief in this hour of national crisis and our willingness as individuals to share in all responsibility which American citizenship imposed upon us to the end that the nation may be preserved."

After the closed meeting in which censorship, transportation of freight vital to the newspaper industry and other such administrative matters were discussed, the A. N. P. A. reelected Walter M. Dear, general manager of the Jersey City, N. J., Journal, as president and reelected other officers and directors with but a few changes.

Omaha, Neb., April 23.—(AP)—Lawrence J. Kennedy, 33, who in 1940 was paroled from McNeill Island federal penitentiary to McGr. E. J. Flanagan at Boys Town, hanged himself with his belt in a city jail cell here last night, Detective Capt. Harry Green said.

Son of M. J. Kennedy, swimming coach at Amherst, Mass., college, Kennedy had been arrested for questioning in the

theft of an automobile in Chicago.
The hanging took place a few hours after Kennedy tearfully unfolded his troubles to his wife of eight months. She told police she didn't know of Kennedy's past when she was married to him.
