

POSTER CONTEST WINNERS TOLD BY LEGION AUXILIARY

Winners of the annual Poppy Poster contest, sponsored by the American Legion auxiliary were announced today by Mrs. Minnie Bryant, who for the past seven years has acted as chairman of the event in this city. Judges for the contest this year were Harry Hinman, Jack Swann and Herb Grey.

Senior high school winners were: Seeley Hall, first; Bob Brown, second; junior high school, Aubrey Davis, first; Regina Smith, second; grade schools, Patsy Mashburn of Jackson school, first and Mary Adams, Washington school, second. Honorable mention was awarded Betty Lemmon of Lincoln school and Ann Butler, Roosevelt school.

The poppy, as a memorial flower for the World War dead, has been used since Nov. 9, 1918. The wild flower itself grew in the fields of France and Flanders during and following World War No. 1 and is now made and sold throughout the country for the benefit of American veterans in hospitals. The poppies are made in 77 hospitals and disabled veterans' workrooms in 42 different states. Materials are furnished and all proceeds are used by the veterans to support their dependents.

The first prize winning posters from Medford will be sent to Moro, Oregon to compete in the state contest and will be exhibited at the state convention in Eugene. Medford has won first state awards five times. Mrs. Bryant announced today. Medford posters are to be displayed in the window of Mark A. Goldy Real Estate office on West Main street.

FLAMES CONSUME RURAL RESIDENCE

Only a small amount of bedding was saved when the two-story, four-room log dwelling of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Pruitt two miles north of Central Point burned to the ground about 2 p.m. yesterday.

The Pruitts were not certain as to the cause of the blaze, but said either a spark from the chimney or defective wiring might have been the origin. Pruitt was working in a field on his ranch when he noticed the

flames which started apparently on the roof. Mrs. Pruitt was at home but was unable to carry water quickly enough or to call neighbors.

Bedding saved was carried to a shed on the property and sleeping quarters arranged there.

According to Pruitt his land has been marked by the government for cantonment property and he planted crops this spring with the risk of losing them.

Torpedoed Ships Brought to Port
