ROSETTA KENNEY, VALLEY PIONEER, TAKEN BY DEATH

Rosetta Ulrich Kenney, 83, beloved resident of Medford and southern Oregon, where she has lived for over 80 years, passed away at the home of her daughter, Frances Kenney, 812 Bennett street early Tuesday after three years illness.

Mrs. Kenney was born at Burlington, Iowa, January 9, 1859. She crossed the plains by ox-wagon with her parents, when she was six weeks of age, coming directly to Jacksonville, Oregon, from Iowa, the trip taking many weeks.

Her parents, the late Mr. and Mrs. Christian Ulrich, were of the earliest pioneers in Jackson county. Her early life was spent in Jacksonville, and for the past 25 years she and Mr. Kenney had lived in Medford. Thomas J. Kenney was united in marriage to Rosetta Ulrich in Jacksonville, Dec. 23, 1878. Seven children were born to this union, three of whom, with the husband, survive. They are Miss Frances Kenney, of Medford; Mrs. Walter Tracey Kentner, of Santa Barbara, Calif.; and Christian Kenney of Jacksonville, Ore.; also five grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted from Perl funeral home Thursday at 2 p. m., the Rev. Father Herald Gardner officiating. Interment will take place in Jacksonville cemetery.

FIND THREE DEAD WITH ARMY PLANE
