RUSSIANS HAMMER LUFTWAFFE BASES

Moscow, June 5.—(P)—Fighting to safeguard Russia's Arctic ocean route for war supplies from Britain and the United States, the red air force has hammered home three hard attacks on the bases from which German bombers have been ranging the far northern seaways, dispatches from Murmansk reported today.

At least 40 German planes were said to have been destroyed in addition to the damage to the Nazi-held landing fields (presumably in the Petsamo region of Finland and the frozen north cape country of Norway.) With both armies throwing increasing numbers of men, tanks and planes into local encounters all along the front, the red army was reported to have ejected the Germans from favorable lines and improved its own positions in the Kalinin and Leningrad sectors.

IT'S OFFICIAL NOW
Washington, June 5.—(P)—The United States went to war officially today with Bulgaria, Hungary and Rumania when President Roosevelt signed a congressional resolution passed by both houses yesterday.

Germans Will Deny Food or Water to British Prisoners

Berlin, (from German broadcasts) June 5.—(AP)—The German high command declared today that British prisoners captured in the Libyan battle would be denied food and drink until the British canceled an order which the Germans said resulted in mistreatment of German prisoners.

London, June 5.—(AP)—A well-informed British source said today that the German allegation of improper treatment by the British of prisoners in Libya was without foundation. He said it had not been determined immediately whether the British government would take official notice of the charge.

TEAMSTERS CONCLAVE GOING TO SAN JOSE

Portland, Ore., June 5.—(P)—The western conference of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters (AFL) chose San Jose, Calif., for next year's meeting today as Dave Beck, Seattle, announced that women will be taken into the union. "We are in favor of female help being employed wherever they can relieve men," the teamsters' international vice-president said. "The women will be taken into our organization and we expect no wage differential if the women do the work of men."
