

Six Explosive Firms Charged With Fixing Prices for Country

E. I. Du Pont De Nemours and Company, five other explosive manufacturers and 10 of their officials were indicted by a federal grand jury today on charges of conspiring to fix prices in violation of the Sherman Anti-Trust Act.

Also named were the Hercules Powder Company and the Atlas Powder Company, both of Wilmington, Del.; the Austin Powder Company of Cleveland; Illinois Powder Manufacturing Co., St. Louis; and the King Powder Company, Cincinnati.

The 10-page indictment contended that the effect of the alleged conspiracy was to "maintain the prices of commercial explosives and blasting supplies to all classes of consumers at high, arbitrary and artificial levels."

White Shirts' Head Guilty of Sedition

Chattanooga, Tenn., June 5.—(AP)—George W. Christians, 59-year-old engineer-economist and self-styled leader of the Crusade White Shirts, was convicted in federal court today on four counts of sedition.

Judge Leslie Darr, presiding, deferred sentence, pending hearing a motion for a new trial.

Christians was charged with attempting to incite rebellion in the armed forces, and with interfering with their enlistment by sending violently-worded letters and pamphlets to civil and military authorities.

Jap Navy Officers Shot in Madagascar

London, June 5.—(AP)—The war office announced today that two Japanese naval officers had been shot by a British patrol Monday in a village north of British-occupied Diego Suarez on the island of Madagascar.

There had been repeated reports prior to the British occupation that the Japanese might attempt to seize the strategic island off the east African coast.

New Orleans (AP)—Charity hospital is building a bombproof vault in which to store radium. If a bomb should hit and scatter the radium supply, according to Dr. Oliver P. Daly, superintendent, "no one could live around this section of the city for 100 years."
