RAF DAWN PATROL SINKS NAZI SHIP

London, June 11—(P)—An RAF Spitfire squadron on dawn patrol sank a German motor vessel and damaged four barges in a canal in the Neuport district of Belgium today.

Flight Sergeant Murphy of the Canadian air force, whose home is St. Clair, Michigan, silenced an anti-aircraft battery and managed to get home safely even though anti-aircraft fire had cut a 15-inch piece off his wing.

British fighters blasted Nazi airbases in the low countries and military targets in northern France last night, the air ministry announced today, as bad weather over the continent was blamed for keeping the RAF away from Germany for the second successive night.

All planes participating in the overnight forays returned safely.
