

IMMUNIZATION OF YOUNG CHILDREN GOAL OF P.-T.A.

Pre-School Ages Treated
Free—Recreation Activities Aided For Many Ages.

In the interest of good health practices, especially among preschool children, the Medford P.-T. A. council has completed arrangements to have children immunized during the summer through the facilities of the county health office in the court house. Nurses and a physician will be available for the work on Wednesdays from 3 to 5 p. m. and Saturdays from 8:30 a. m. to 11:30 a. m. No charge will be made for pre-schoolers and only a small fee for older children. The service is open to all children.

The council at a recent meeting at the home of Mrs. Herbert Sims, president, voted to end a letter to the county budget committee approving the item in the proposed budget for a county juvenile officer.

Your Influence Make or Break Says Griffith

Rev. Glenn Griffith, evangelist, speaking at the Church of the Nazarene, Holly at First, took his text from Gal. 6:7, "Be not deceived, God is not mocked for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap," and preached from the topic, "Influence."

Some of the highlights of the message follow:

"Influence is that unconscious outflow of personality that makes or breaks one and either leads those with whom he comes in contact to Christ or away from him. Strange as it may seem, we do not live alone or die alone. We are influencing for good or for bad. We are making footprints on the sand of time and they either lead to Christ and salvation or to a wasted life and ruin."

"When one considers the scope and influence of an individual it is tremendous. For instance, when one individual can influence a nation to go to the polls and vote to loose upon a nation the terrible liquor traffic, with its sad results you have some conception of what influence can do."

"A professor, whether in high school or university who doubts the deity of Christ, the authenticity of God's word, or the immaculate conception, with a class of 50 students under his teaching, may wreck the faith of that entire group, because of their confidence in him as a leader. Then, as they go out, the stream of influence has enlarged from one personality to 50 in as many different walks of life to spread the same doubt, until eventually whole communities lose faith in God through their influence."

"One who takes the name of mother and is careless in her conduct, becomes an addict to the habit of smoking or drinking or other detrimental influence, may cause her whole family to go astray and be lost. Or, a father who thoughtlessly leads his boys in footsteps that are not straight may spoil their lives and cause his children to be lost. A worldly church leader, with a careless attitude toward the laws of God, may induce many with whom he associates to drift from the ideals of Christ and come to the judgment defeated."

"Another fact about influence, good or bad, is that it does not stop at the grave but continues on even after death. A word that is spoken out of time can never be recalled, but it will continue to blight or bless until the end of time."

"Remember, it is not what you say you are, but what your deeds prove you to be that influences men for good or bad, for out of the heart flow the issues of life. How we need to have the source of influence purified until, at the close of the day we shall stand without condemnation in God-likeness. God give us church members and parents, and leaders, with holy influence. We can then precipitate real revivals and bring a world that's torn with war and selfishness and sin back to Jesus Christ."

Menus of the Day

Sautéed Chicken with Dessert Course
Dinner Serving 3
Chilled Diced Fruit
Bottled Salmon
Lemon Flavored Egg Sauce
Buttered Spinach, Diced Carrots
Enriched White Bread
Rhubarb Conserve
Salad-Dessert

Toasted Crackers Coffee
Bottled Salmon
3 pounds salmon steak
4 celery leaves
1 bay leaf
2 whole cloves
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon white pepper
1 tablespoon lemon juice
Loosely tie steak in white cloth, place in boiling water with rest of ingredients added. Cover, lower heat and simmer 30 minutes (about 10 minutes per pound). Drain thoroughly. Garnish on serving platter with parsley and lemon wedges. Serve hot or chilled.

Lemon Flavored Egg Sauce
3 tablespoons butter
4 tablespoons flour
2 cups milk
1-3 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon paprika
1/4 teaspoon minced parsley
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1 beaten egg or 2 yolks
1 hard-boiled egg minced
Melt butter, add flour, blend and pour in milk. Cook slowly, stirring constantly until thick and creamy. Add rest of ingredients, cook a minute.

Salad-Dessert
5 slices lettuce
3 tablespoons French dressing
1/2 cup white cream cheese
2 tablespoons jelly, or jam
Chill and serve cut lettuce in 1-3 inch slices. Sprinkle with dressing spread with cheese and jelly blended.

Cocktail snacks are prepared by mixing equal portions of chopped salted peanuts, ripe olives and cream cheese. Serve on bread or toast.

Hard sauce with brown sugar and flavored lightly with cloves and make makes a grand top spread for fruit puddings.
