

JACKSON COUNTY AMONG FEW WITH WATER SHORTAGE

Farmers in Most Areas of
West Facing Abundant
Irrigation Supply, is Word

Washington, June 16—(AP)—Farmers in most areas of the far western states can look forward to abundant water supplies for irrigation this year, the department of agriculture said today.

The prediction was based on extensive snow surveys of the past spring. Measurements on main watersheds and snow courses indicated that the season's run-off would range from around normal to better, and that most reservoirs would be "well filled."

For Oregon as a whole the department said the snow water content on 89 per cent of all courses was greater than in 1941 and in most cases was greater than in 1940 and 1938.

More Stored Water
"Deep soil moisture of crop land through the state was reported fully as good as last year and better than average—the best of a decade in some dry land farm areas," the report said.

"More water is stored in reservoirs than for several years. The large Owyhee, Vale and Klamath projects started the season with exceptionally favorable irrigation supplies, either in storage or prospect."

"Such also was the case on Burnt river, in most of the interior basin, and on Crooked river. Water shortage of greater or less extent were in prospect for lands served by the headwaters of the main Deschutes river and in irrigated lands of Jackson and Josephine counties in southern Oregon."

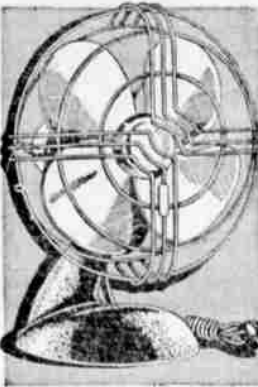

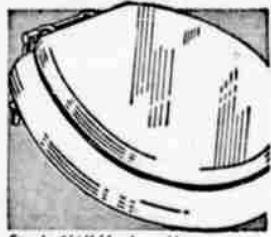

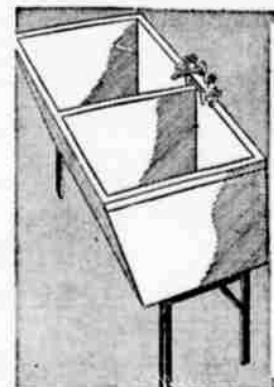
