PUPPET PRESIDENT PENS RESIGNATION

Buenos Aires, June 25.—(P)—Roberto Ortiz, Argentina's all-time and inactive president, today signed a letter resigning his office.

If accepted by congress, which two years ago rejected a similar resignation by Ortiz, the resignation would hand over the executive power of Argentina in name as well as in fact to Acting President Ramon S. Castillo, whose "policy of prudent neutrality" has maintained this country's relations with the axis.

Buenos Aires, June 25.—(P)—Foreign Minister Enrique Guinazu announced today that Argentina is protesting to Germany against the "aggression" committed in the submarine sinking of the Argentine vessel Rio Tercero.

SHOE SHINE PRICE ALSO UNDER ROOF

Washington, June 25.—(P)—The cost of shoe shines, automobile repairs, piano tuning, funerals and all other consumer services will be limited beginning July 1 to the highest levels charged in March.

The Office of Price Administration issued price ceiling regulations last night that will affect 1,000,000 establishments doing an annual business of \$5,000,000 throughout the country. It supplements the price control order of April 28 covering consumer goods.

Exempted from the new regulations were professional services, such as those performed by physicians, dentists, lawyers and barbers.

Canning Sugar Application Instructions Are Provided

For the benefit of local residents making application for canning sugar the ration board in the Sparta building has provided the following instructions for filling out canning sugar applications.

Home canning applicants are asked to leave lines one and two blank as they have no bearing on canning for home use. Lines three and four should have the name and address of the family unit (regardless of the number of people in the family). Line five should contain the amount of sugar for which the application is made. This line will be separate from the jams, jellies, etc.

Line six should contain the amount of sugar on hand at the time the canning application is made out. Section or line seven should contain the serial number of war ration book one together with names of members of the family unit. Also in section seven the applicant should make notation of the amount of fruit canned last year (separate and apart from jams, jellies, etc) and the amount they intend to can this year.

If war ration books were not issued (due to an excess amount of sugar on hand at time of consumer registration) the applicant will state how many are in the family unit.

The form must be signed by the applicant and dated after which it will be submitted to the local board for approval and certificates made out. One week must be allowed in order to get certificates ready for the purpose of canning sugar. The application must be filled out in duplicate.

WOMEN ASSURED HOSE FOR 1942

New York, June 25.—(P)—Women's stocking needs for the rest of 1942 can be supplied, Alfred Hoffman, first vice president of the American Federation of Hosiery Workers, said today.

Hoffman said 32,000,000 dozen pairs of rayon-and-cotton stockings would be on the market this year against 44,000,000 dozen in 1940. Men's hosiery would be ample, he added.

Shoe production in May was 39,000,000 pairs, 6.8 per cent below May, 1941. First decline in any month since October, 1940, it reflected price ceiling uncertainties and limited supplies of sole leather for civilian use.

GAS CONSUMPTION DOWN
Salem, June 25.—(P)—Gasoline consumption in Oregon during May was nine per cent less than in May, 1941, while traffic deaths were down 28 per cent, the state department said today. Consumption during the first five months of the year was down four per cent from the corresponding period of 1941.

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W. U. PRESIDENT IN SUDDEN PASSING

Salem, June 25.—(P)—Dr. Carl Sumner Knopf, 52, president of Willamette university since last September, died at his home here yesterday of a heart attack. He had been in ill health for several months.

Dr. Knopf, who came here from the University of Southern California, where he had been dean of the school of religion, resigned the presidency on May 29, effective next September 1. His resignation was tendered after charges by the Salem post of the American Legion that he sought to register for selective service as a conscientious objector.

CCC CONTINUANCE IN NEW SETBACK

Washington, June 25.—(P)—Administration efforts to continue the functions of the Civilian Conservation Corps suffered a new setback today when the senate appropriation committee declined to supply \$80,818,000 asked for these purposes.

A member said the committee voted 15 to 9 to cut off CCC funds as a wartime economy move. Previously the house had taken similar action.

Home Experiments Bring Death to 4

Huntington Park, Calif., June 25.—(P)—Death toll of an explosion which wrecked a Huntington Park home last night rose to four today.

The victims: Mrs. Lena Lyons, 42; two daughters, Catherine, 20, and Helen, 7; a son, Billy, 13.

Police Sgt. J. B. Martin said gas tanks were discovered in a cluttered room, and quoted neighbors as saying that Lyons, a machinist, had been experimenting with various gasses.

Portland, Ore., June 25.—(P)—Funeral services were held today for Mrs. Alice T. Weber of Portland, daughter of the late Jack Dempsey, the "Nonpareil." She died Monday. Dempsey, famed as a middleweight boxer before the turn of the century, once held the championship in that division.
