

RUBBER MAKING EASY DECLARES CHEMURGY CHIEF

Can Produce All U. S. Needs
In Year If Given Money,
Men and Priorities, Claim.

Washington, June 26.—(AP)—Dr. William J. Hale, head of a Chemurgy firm, testified before a house mining sub-committee today he could produce all the rubber the nation needs in a year if given \$100,000,000, men and priorities.

The former organic professor at the University of Michigan, now consultant to the Dow Chemical company and president of the National Agrol company, Washington, said he would set up about 100 plants—with two in each state—each turning out 45,000 pounds of butadiene daily from certain types of corn.

Another \$150,000,000 would be required by the rubber industry to make the rubber from the butadiene, he said, adding that his synthetic product would make tires superior to those now in use.

"We can produce rubber for probably 5 cents a pound," he asserted, from waxey maize and grain sorghums, and you can always make it cheaper as you progress. It can be made in enormous quantities at a very small cost and not even disturb the surplus corn crop.

Corn Required
"One hundred and 50 million bushels of corn will produce all the rubber we can possibly use, and that's not five per cent of our crop."

Dr. Hale said the War Production board and Department of Agriculture were aware of facts that could be performed by Chemurgy.

Excluding President Roosevelt and Donald Nelson, War Production board chairman, Dr. Hale accused the WPB organization of "not wanting to win the war."

He said WPB officials were "hamstrung by steel and oil industries" which he said were in effect "Hitler cohorts."

Dr. Hale said that the petroleum industry received \$50 million dollars with which to make synthetic rubber, but that it could not hope to make more than 25,000 tons in a year, and that no rubber as yet had been produced.

840,000 CASES COTS IS GOVERNMENT NEED

Washington, June 26.—(AP)—The agriculture department today asked canners to submit offers for 840,000 cases of solid pack canned apricots for lend-lease shipment.

The department said it would pay \$9 per dozen for No. 10 size cans of U. S. grade F-solid pack pie apricots provided the canners agreed to pay growers at least \$70 a ton for the fresh fruit delivered at the cannery.

Wife Preservers

Here is a table which tells the amount of contents of various sizes of cans: Buffet or picnic size holds 4 cups; Number 1 holds 1 1/3 cups; Number 2 tall, contains 2 cups; Number 2 can, 2 1/2 cups; Number 2 1/2 sized can, 3 1/2 cups; Number 3, 4 cups. Ask your grocer the size of can and you can then easily compute the size for your family needs.
