

CANNING SUGAR MAY BE BOUGHT IN INSTALLMENT

Portland, (Sp.)—Home canners must not necessarily purchase their entire year's supply of canning sugar at one time, although such practice is urged when convenient, according to Richard G. Montgomery, State office of price administration director.

To eliminate clerical work among the local ration boards the state office directed the boards to urge home canners to declare and purchase their year's supply. Some boards, according to reports reaching the state office, have held that this is mandatory, which is not the case.

"It is, of course, impossible for persons to forecast accurately the amount of fruit which unripened crops will ultimately bear," W. C. Dirker, sugar ration executive, said, "and any home canner who uses up her supply of sugar actually in canning may secure additional supplies later in the season by applying to her local war price ration board."

Local sugar ration board said today that the above ruling is in effect here.

The rationing board also called attention of retailers that stamps five and six were good for only two pounds of sugar apiece. Number five stamp is for the month of July it was explained and number six stamp is to be used for the month of August.

Coast Dimout Seen For War Duration

Salem, June 30.—(P)—The dimout of the Pacific coast probably will last for the duration of the war, Frank A. Hansen, San Francisco, lighting engineer for the region office of civilian defense, said yesterday at a meeting here of civilian defense officials and of representatives of power companies serving the coastal area.

Motorists Warned To Obtain Federal Tags

Portland, June 30.—(P)—Motorists were warned today that federal officers will start tagging automobiles after July 1 if they do not have federal use tax stamps.

J. W. Maloney, internal revenue collector, reminded drivers that present stamps expire June 30. The new stamps, costing \$5, will be good for the 1942-43 fiscal year.

TWO NEW UNITS IN CIVILIAN DEFENSE FIXED FOR STATE

Salem, June 30.—(P)—Creation of two new units of the civilian defense organization was announced today by State Civilian Defense Coordinator Jerrold Owen.

The U. S. citizens service corps will include those working in such activities as consumers' interest, salvage, recreation, war savings, education, health, nutrition, transportation and other types of community war activity carried on with the approval of the state defense council.

The civilian defense auxiliary group will include persons who, because of their civil occupations, should be eligible to be on the streets and perform their duties during blackouts and air raids.

Special insignia will be provided for members of each group. The new units are in addition to regular civilian defense activities.

Persons who may be included in the auxiliary group include: Doctors, registered nurses, members of the clergy, newspaper reporters, press photographers, news reel cameramen, operators of essential transportation facilities, telegraph messengers, telephone and telegraph operators, representatives of humane societies, and undertakers.

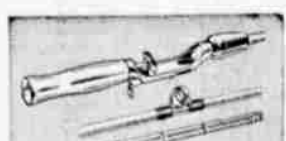

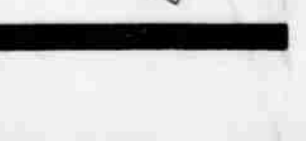
