570 REGISTER IN DRAFT BOARD TWO

Registration of males between the ages of 18 and 20 years totaled 570 at the county court house yesterday, according to Selective Service board number 1. Board number two, which comprises outlying districts from Medford, was expected to have completed its count by late this afternoon.

Of the 570 registered yesterday 312 were from Medford, the other 258 being out-of-state, CCC and Camp White employees. Polls were open yesterday between 7 a. m. and 9 p. m. for this latest registration of manpower in America, ordered by the federal government.

Exactly how much of a surplus there is probably will not be known for at least 90 days. But state officials estimate it may amount to as high as \$25,000,000.
